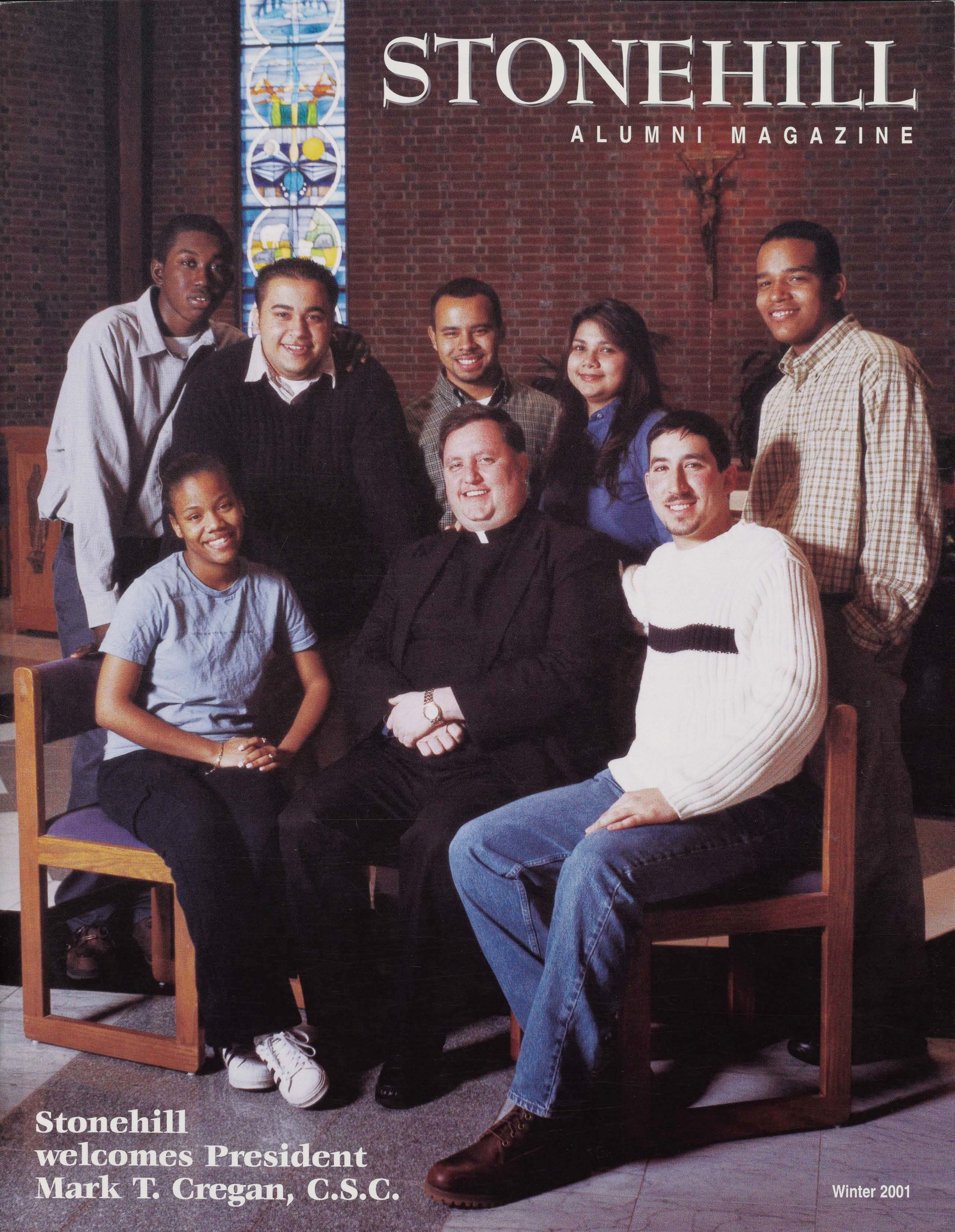

The Hill is Newest Campus Hotspot

On Jan. 16, before a capacity crowd of students, faculty and administrators, the College's new multi-purpose social space for students opened in the Roche Dining Commons. Called *The Hill*, the social space offers students a central location where they can dine, listen to music, play pool, watch big screen events, and congregate in a casual yet comfortable atmosphere.

Located on the ground floor of the Roche Commons, *The Hill* succeeds Brother Mike's Coffeehouse and can accommodate 480 students. It has an aquarium, an electric piano, a mural depicting campus scenes, a fireplace and memorabilia from Brother Mike's, which has been renovated and integrated into O'Hara Hall's residence structure.

Vice President and Dean of Student Affairs Louis Saltrelli advocated for the new social space and he is pleased with the fresh options that *The Hill* offers to students and to the College.

"*The Hill* can accommodate small concerts, dances and special events like Karaoke nights, comedy acts and big-screen parties. It can also host educational events like pub debates and poetry readings.

It recently had a well-attended comedy night, featuring a young alumni Improv group. *The Hill* is spacious, nicely designed, and opened at all the right times for students," Saltrelli said.

Open from 7 a.m. until midnight, *The Hill* serves coffee and pastries all day long. At lunch, it serves sandwiches, salads and soup and, in the evening, there is a snack bar menu. *The Hill* also serves alcohol on a limited basis and events featuring alcohol are usually confined to weekend evenings.

According to Student Government Association President Lauren Hall '01, student reaction to *The Hill* has been positive. "Ever since *The Hill* opened, students have taken advantage of everything it has to offer," she says. "It's a hit. Even with Brother Mike's, students did not have a place that provided us with such an array of things to do. *The Hill* appeals to all students because it meets so many different needs."

Visitors to *The Hill* are encouraged. If you are on campus, stop in and soak up the atmosphere at one of the College's most dynamic and exciting locations.

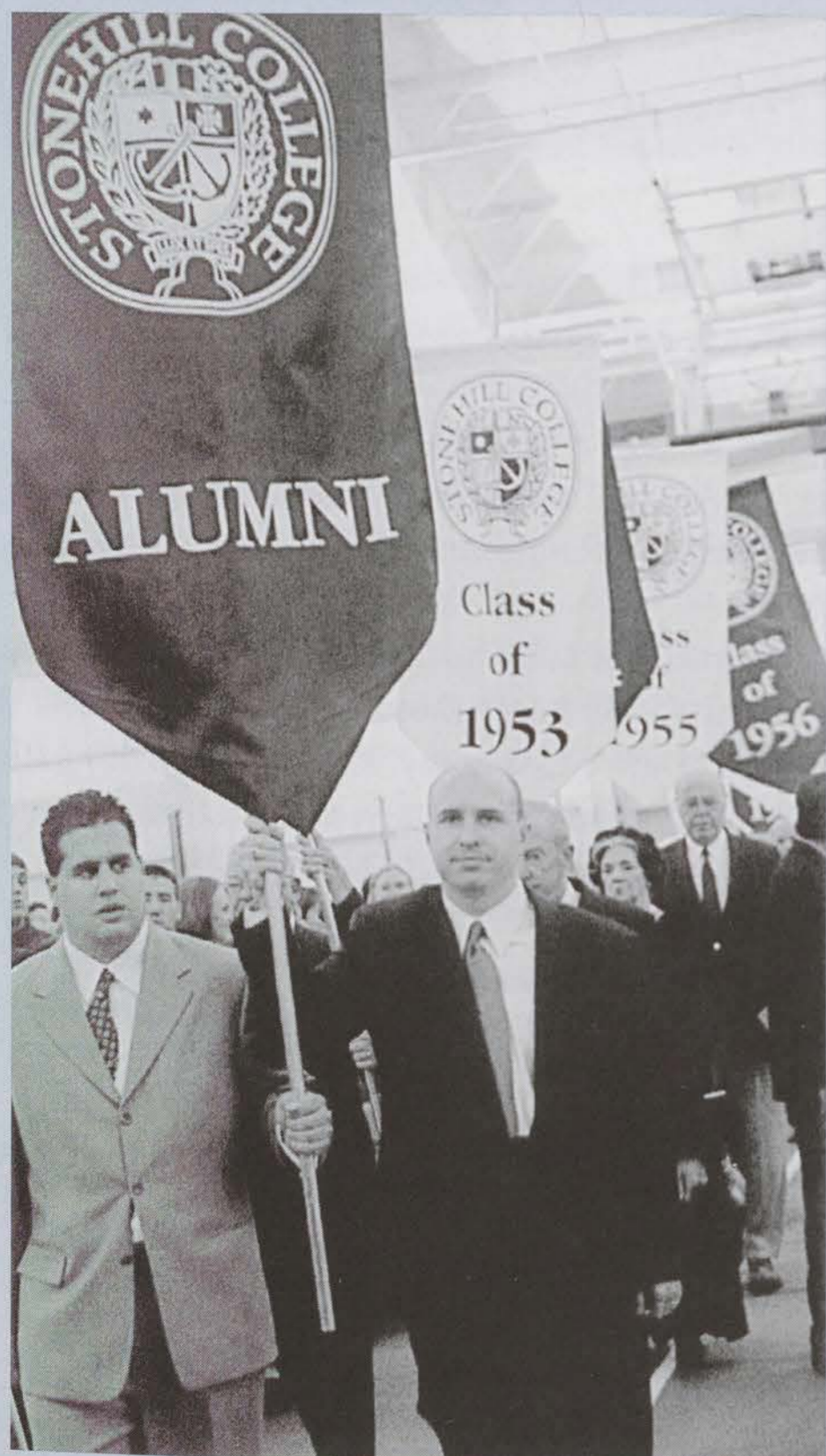
Academics Celebrated at Convocation

The Inauguration of the College's ninth president took place in September at Stonehill's annual Academic Convocation. [See page 8 for full coverage of Inauguration.] These ceremonies were held jointly in order to underscore the College's commitment to academics and to emphasize the College's dedication to being a community of learners.

To celebrate Convocation, *Washington Post* columnist E. J. Dionne, Jr. delivered the keynote address. In his remarks, Dionne, a native of Fall River and a recipient of an honorary degree from Stonehill in 1987, noted that the current generation of students, while interested in career opportunities, is also interested in helping others.

Dionne told students that their "generation could be the great reform generation." He urged them to "bend history for the better."

Reflecting Stonehill's strengths and its history, the Academic Convocation ceremonies also connect the College to a larger academic tradition. And, in transmitting an academic tradition to new generations of students, Convocation reaches out in a special way to seniors and freshmen.

Each senior receives a Senior Pin, which is a golden reproduction of the College's seal. Given in recognition of their academic accomplishments, the Pin is also worn by seniors at Commencement.

Each freshman receives an atlas, which symbolizes openness to the richness and diversity of the wider world. As a reminder that the world is in a state of flux, freshmen are advised to consult their atlases during their college career to note the political, social and cultural changes that occur constantly in the world.

New Life for Old Library

The Cushing Martin Building is being renovated to house the English, Fine Arts, and Communication departments, as well as studio space for students, a computer lab, and several multi-media classrooms. There will also be an art gallery for guest exhibits. The Stonehill Industrial History Center, including its extensive collections of historic materials such as the Arnold B. Tofias Industrial Archives and the Ames Family Collection, will also move to the new facility. The relocated Center will include proper storage spaces, a research facility, and an exhibit space, physically demonstrating the College's reinvigorated mission for these nationally significant collections. The building will re-open in September.



AT&T Sponsors *Fear No People*

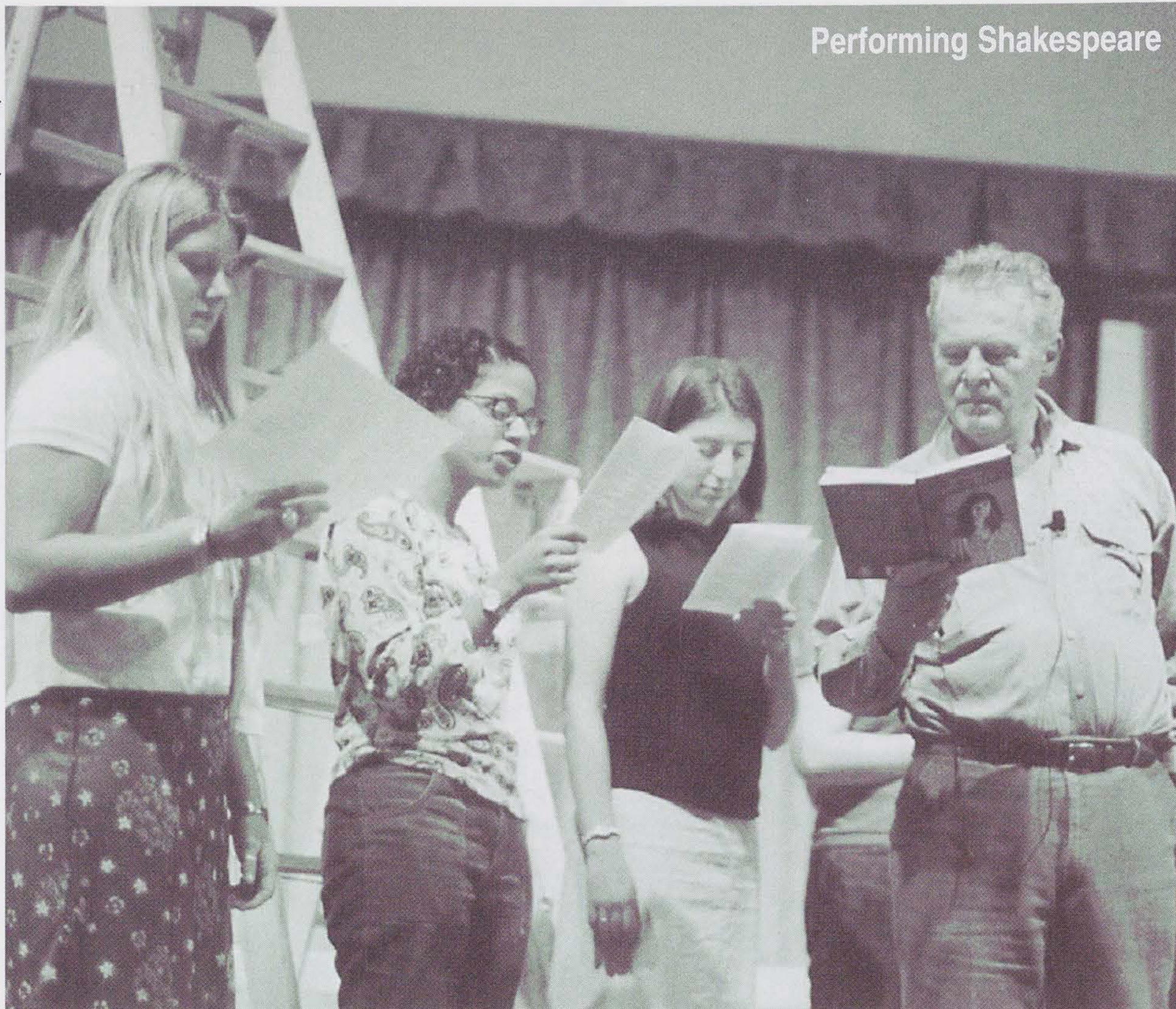

Performing Shakespeare

Romeo, Oh Romeo

Last fall, the English Department presented its fourth annual "Shakespeare Week," featuring one of the world's greatest love stories, *Romeo and Juliet*.

All students enrolled in the 16 sections of "Literary Traditions," a required general studies course, read the play. A week of events was then planned to celebrate *Romeo and Juliet*.

Events included a lecture and staging of scenes from *Romeo and Juliet* by former British Broadcasting Company director James Cellan Jones, pictured here with (L-R) Lacey Dwyer '01, Vanessa Crews '01 and Erin Ward '03; a ballet performance by the Cadence Dance Company; an interactive dramatic performance by professional actors John Douglas Thompson and Eric Tucker; and a festival of movie versions of the play.

The first "Shakespeare Week" featured *Hamlet*. It was so well received, that the Department followed with *Much Ado About Nothing* in 1998 and *Othello* in 1999. Each year, the Department organizes a film festival, various lectures and readings, and dance and music events. Last year, students attended a production of *Othello* at Trinity Repertory Theatre in Providence, R.I.

"Shakespeare Week" activities were coordinated by Professor of English Barbara Estrin and sponsored by the Academic Dean's Office, the Student Government Association, the Martin Institute, the Office of Intercultural Affairs, and the English, Political Science and Fine Arts departments.

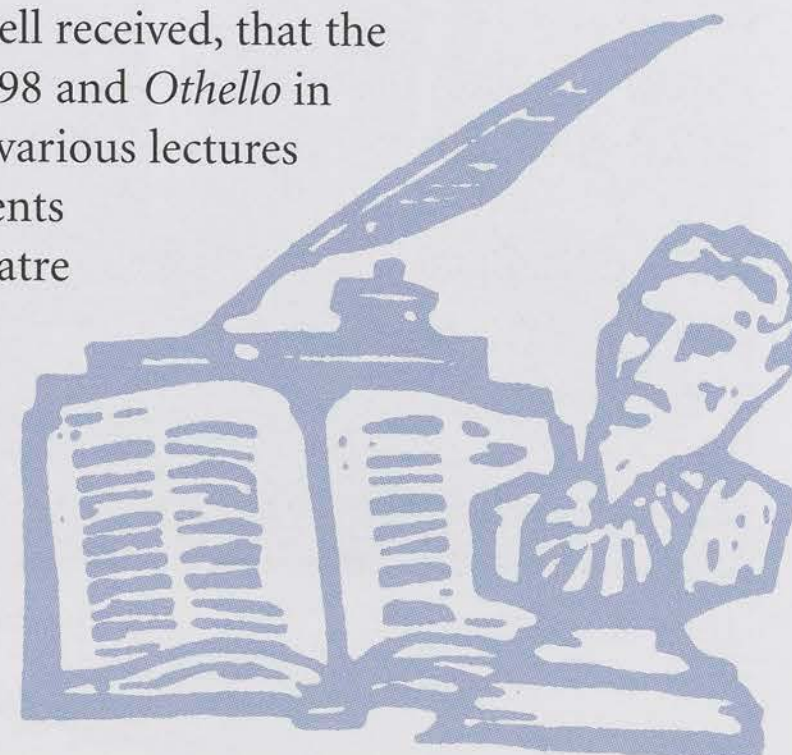

Cleary Dining Room Named

In October 2000, the College recognized C. James Cleary, Stonehill's seventh president, by dedicating the Faculty/Staff Dining Room in the Roche Dining Commons in his name.

From the struggling early days of the College until his retirement in 1987, Cleary held almost every conceivable role at Stonehill: professor and teacher, department chair, dean, executive vice president, trustee and the

College's only lay president. He brought to all of these roles sound judgement, a firmness of purpose, a great sense of humor, a noble spirit, and an unflinching loyalty to Stonehill.

In honoring Cleary, President Mark Cregan, C.S.C. '78 said, "We seek to acknowledge Jim's service to the College as a faculty member and as a senior administrator. We wish to show him our appreciation for his exceptional service and to ensure that his legacy at the College is a vibrant one."

A Room with a View

The Speakers' Corner

Author **Tim O'Brien** addressed 750 Stonehill students, alumni, and administrators in October. His book, *The Things They Carried*, was selected for the Class of 2004 to read during this past year's Orientation program. O'Brien spoke about where the ideas for his writing come from and read a number of excerpts from his book, which is a series of short stories about the Vietnam War.

Al Ward '90 presented and discussed his documentary, "I'm on the Ballot" in October. The documentary, produced and directed by Ward, compared the campaigns of the Reform, Libertarian, Socialist, Constitution, Natural Law, and Green Party nominees with the campaigns of their Democrat and Republican rivals. It was aired nationally on PBS stations before the U.S. presidential election.



In November, **Thomas O'Grady**, associate professor of English and director of the Irish Studies Program at UMass-Boston, read from his recent collection of poems, *What Really Matters*, in Alumni Hall as part of the Honors Program speaker series.

Venture Forum Showcases Entrepreneurial Efforts in Southeastern Mass.

The Joseph W. Martin Jr. Institute for Law and Society is hosting the Southeastern Massachusetts Venture Forum. The Forum will enable Stonehill students and faculty to learn about entrepreneurial efforts in Southeastern Massachusetts and to interact with business leaders in critiquing business plans.

The monthly forums, which are open to the public, will be held on the first Thursday evenings of April, May, June, October, November and December. The first two programs took place in February and March.

Each program has two elements: a presentation on a topic of interest to entrepreneurs, followed by a case study of an emerging company. The overall goal of the Forum is to increase the visibility of new venture opportunities for investors and other stakeholders, while strengthening the emerging entrepreneurial network in the region.

Organizers of the Forum are the Southeastern Massachusetts Manufacturing Partnership and NTB Associates. Norman Brust, founder of NTB, will serve as Program Chair of the Forum with support from the Partnership and volunteer professionals from the region.

Greener Pastures are Coming

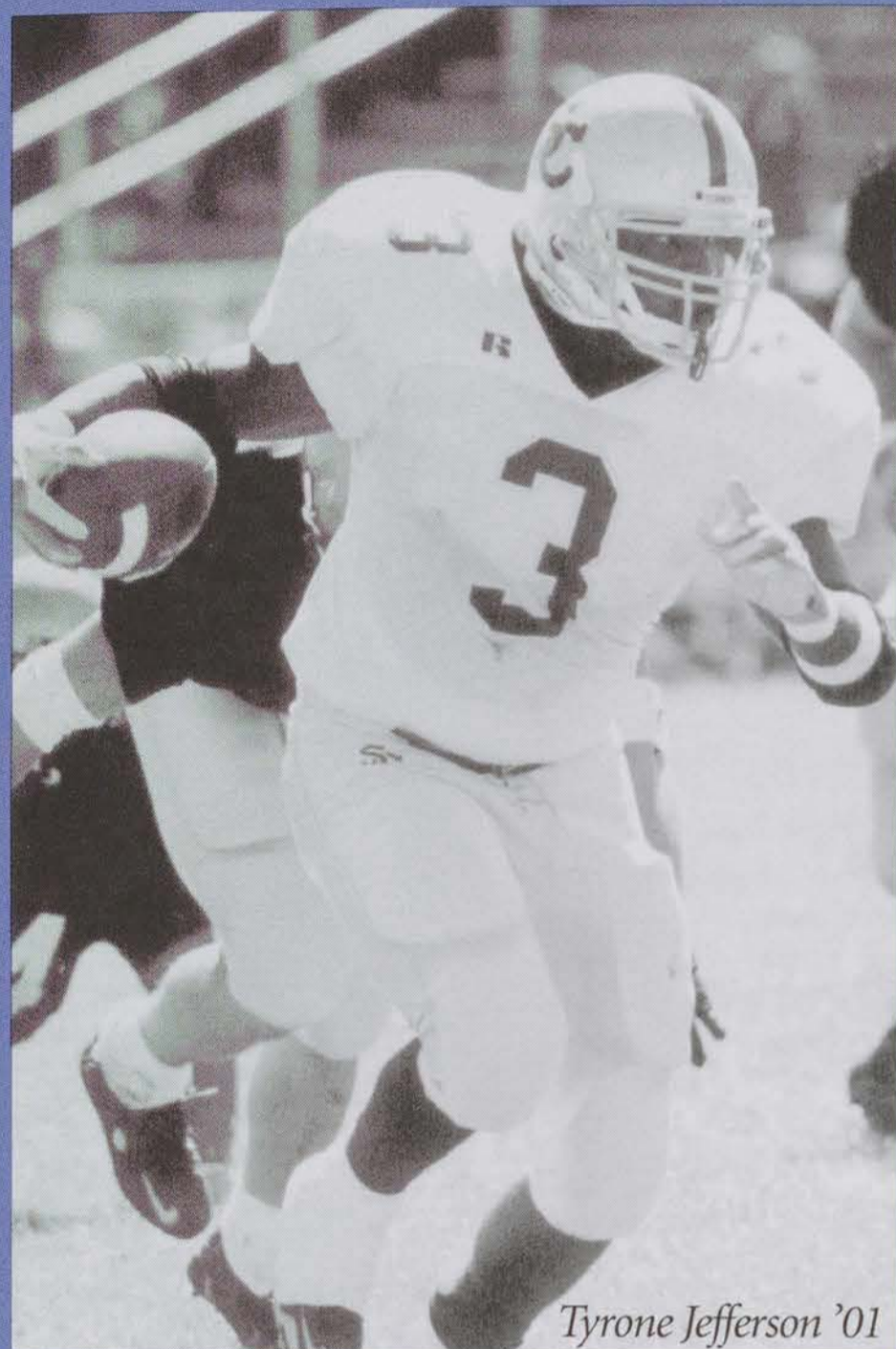
The 600 students participating in club and intramural sports on campus will soon have three new fields on which to play. This fall, the fields will be ready to host recreational competition in rugby, lacrosse, ultimate frisbee, flag football, softball and soccer.

The fields are located on the old Ames Air Field where the Irish Festival has been held in recent years. Even if the grass has not yet begun to grow, the fields are still a welcome sight to fans and athletes alike, as they have had to borrow fields from the varsity teams in

the past, making practices almost impossible and scheduling games often difficult.

Recreational Sports Director John Leahy reports that 75 percent of the incoming freshman class played a varsity sport in high school, while 25 percent of the Stonehill student population participates at the varsity level. "As a result, there is a huge amount of student interest in sports at the club and intramural level," he said. "Our programs allow those athletes who either choose not to play at the varsity level or cannot make the time commitment to still partake in competitive sports and reap the benefits that such activity provides."

Football Standouts Jefferson and Asbell Earn Honors

Stonehill seniors **Tyrone Jefferson** and **Chris Asbell** were both named as first-team selections to the 2000 Eastern Football Conference all-league squad as well as to the all-New England College Division team as chosen by the New England Sports' Writers. Jefferson led the Eastern Football Conference in rushing with a total of 1,267 yards, which also set a new Stonehill single-season rushing mark. He rushed for 100 or more yards in eight of the Chieftains' 10 outings this fall, including a career-high 236 yard effort during a 13-0 win at UMass Lowell in October that earned him the nod as the New England Sports' Writers Gold Helmet Award recipient. Jefferson concluded his career as Stonehill's all-time leading rusher with 2,700 yards in just 30 games. Asbell anchored a Stonehill offensive line that shattered the school record for rushing yards in one season. A three-time all-Eastern Football Conference selection, Asbell also helped the Chieftains allow the fewest amount of sacks in the league this season with 11.

Neff Named to NSCAA Women's Soccer All-America Squad

Kathy Neff '01 earned a spot on the National Soccer Coach's Association of America (NSCAA) Division II All-America team after closing out her Stonehill career by establishing numerous school records and leading Head Coach Jose Gomes' squad to its 10th consecutive winning season. Neff posted 10 victories in goal this fall with eight shutouts in earning all-Northeast-10 Conference honors for a second straight season. She ended her career with 37 victories in net, including a school-record 24 via shutout.

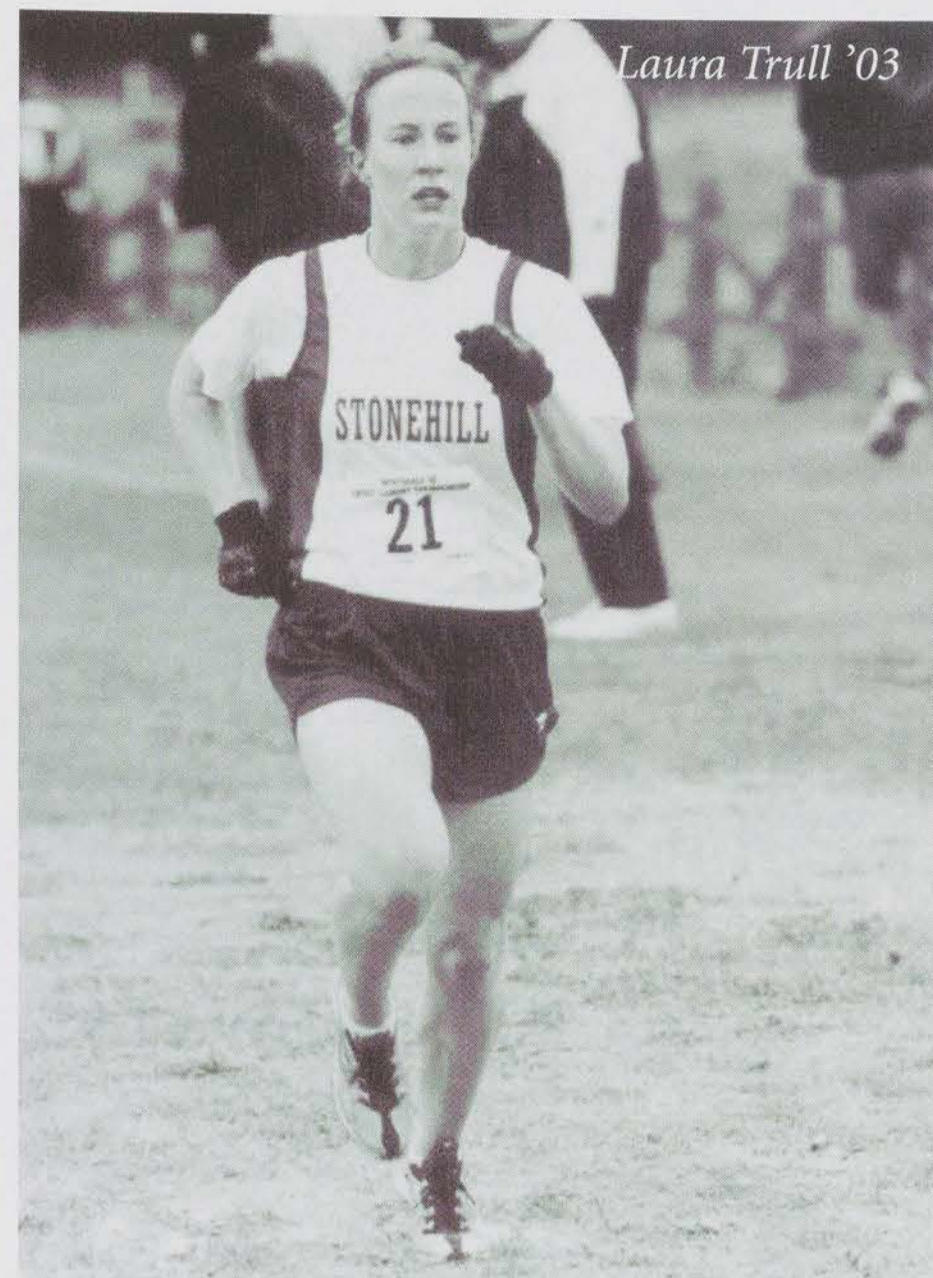

Women's Cross Country Runs Over Competition

This past season the Women's Cross Country Team ran away from their competitors in capturing both the Northeast-10 Conference and NCAA Division II New England Regional titles. The team earned its first-ever trip to the NCAA Division II National Championships in Pomona, Calif., where Stonehill finished 20th.

After pulling away from conference rival Southern Connecticut during the regular season, the runners hit stride in October in hosting the Northeast-10 championships on campus. **Laura Trull '03** paved the way for Stonehill's first conference title by taking top individual honors with a course-record time of 19:14. She followed that up in November by capturing the individual title at the NCAA New England Regionals, earning Regional Runner of the Year accolades along the way. Trull placed 82nd individually at the NCAA National Championships.

Joining Trull on the NCAA all-regional team were **Jennifer Teahan '03** and **Kimberly Nolan '04**, who also earned all-Northeast-10 honors this fall. **Christina Seremetis '03, Kristen Fidler '03** and **Melissa Brown '04**, were named as all-Northeast-10 performers as well for Stonehill, which won the conference championship after finishing eighth at the league race just two years ago. Coach **Karen Boen** was named by her peers as both the Northeast-10 and NCAA New England Regional Coach of the Year for her efforts.

The Inauguration of Rev. Mark T. Cregan, C.S.C. '78

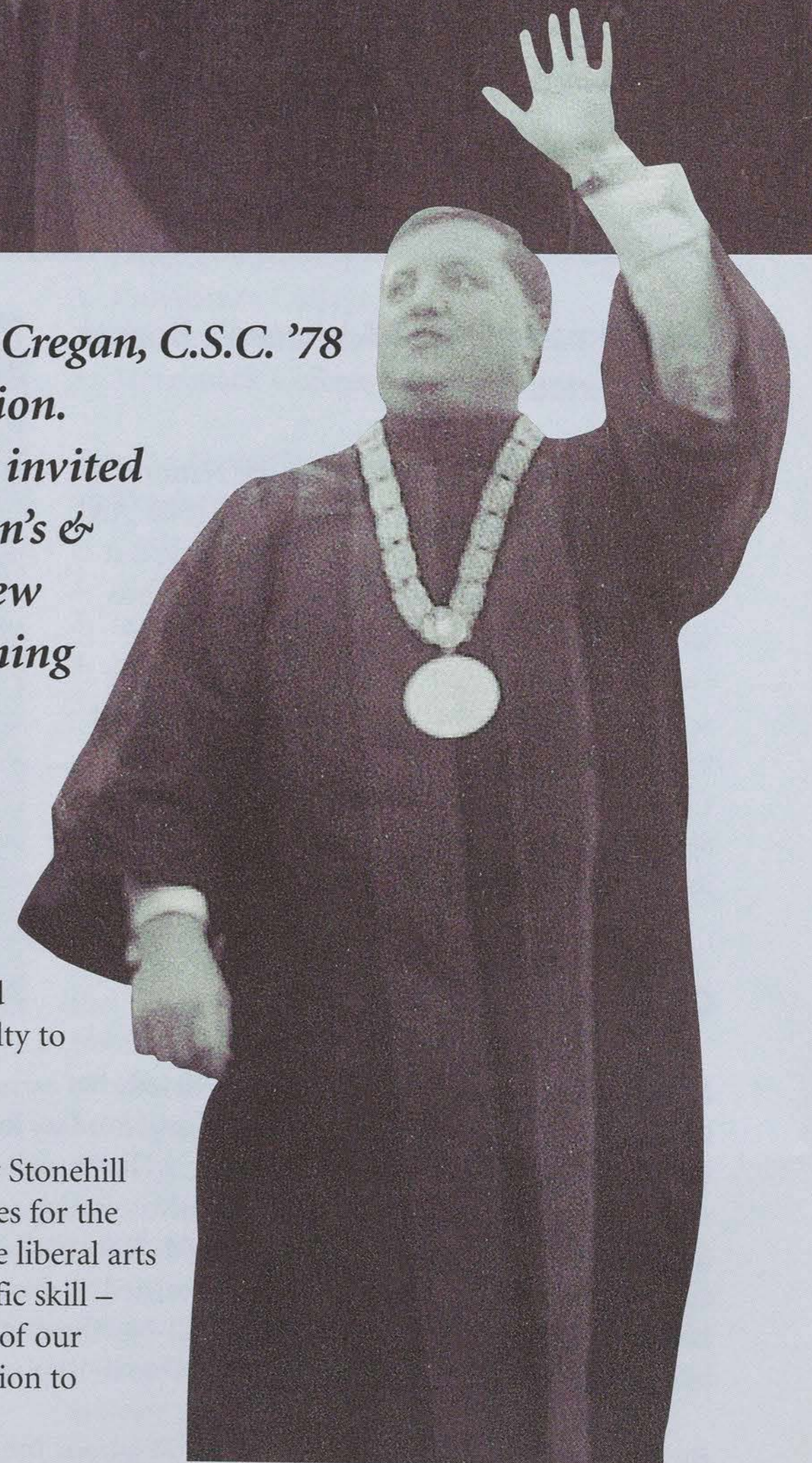

Stonehill inaugurated its ninth president, Rev. Mark T. Cregan, C.S.C. '78 on Sept. 29, 2000 at the College's Academic Convocation. Over 1,000 members of the Stonehill community and invited guests attended the event, which featured the Children's & Youth Choir of Sacred Heart Church in the Bronx, New York, where Fr. Cregan spent eight years before assuming the Stonehill presidency.

In Fr. Cregan's inaugural address, he spoke of the faces and encounters in his own life, which have prompted him to expand his horizons and open his heart. In so doing, he shared with the Stonehill community his spirit and vision for the College. He reflected on his relationships with several professors he had as a student, fellow Board members, current students, staff, faculty, and his presidential predecessors. He also spoke of Stonehill alumni, whose "loyalty to and love for the College is both genuine and deep."

He remarked, "In events at the College and in visits to alumni, I marvel at how Stonehill remains so close to the heart of so many and how much credit Stonehill receives for the demonstrated success of our alumni. This dynamic is one of the fruits of a true liberal arts education where it is the development of the person – as opposed to any specific skill – which is the goal of the Stonehill educational project. The loyalty and support of our alumni have been and is crucial to our success in providing this type of education to future generations of young men and women."



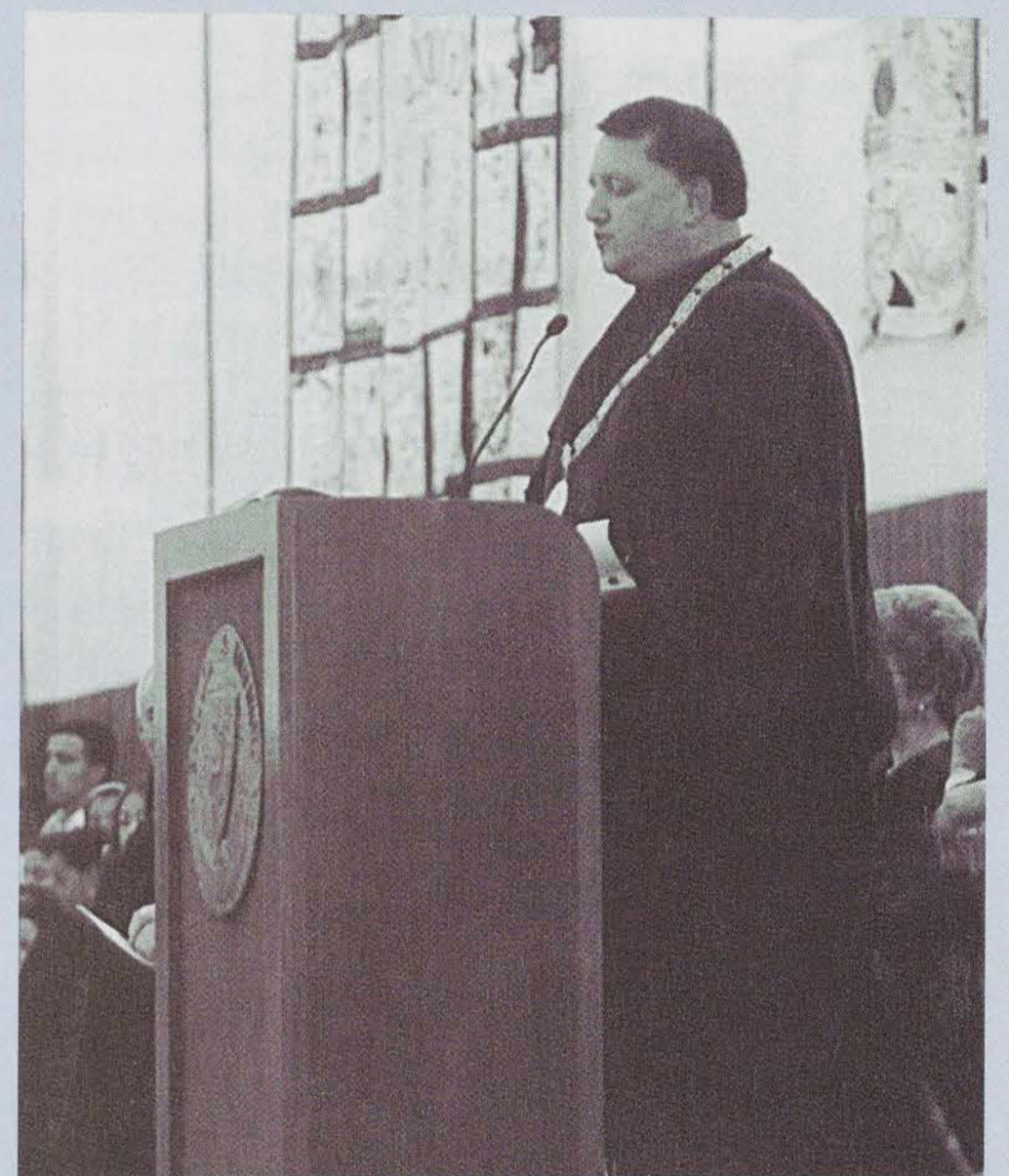

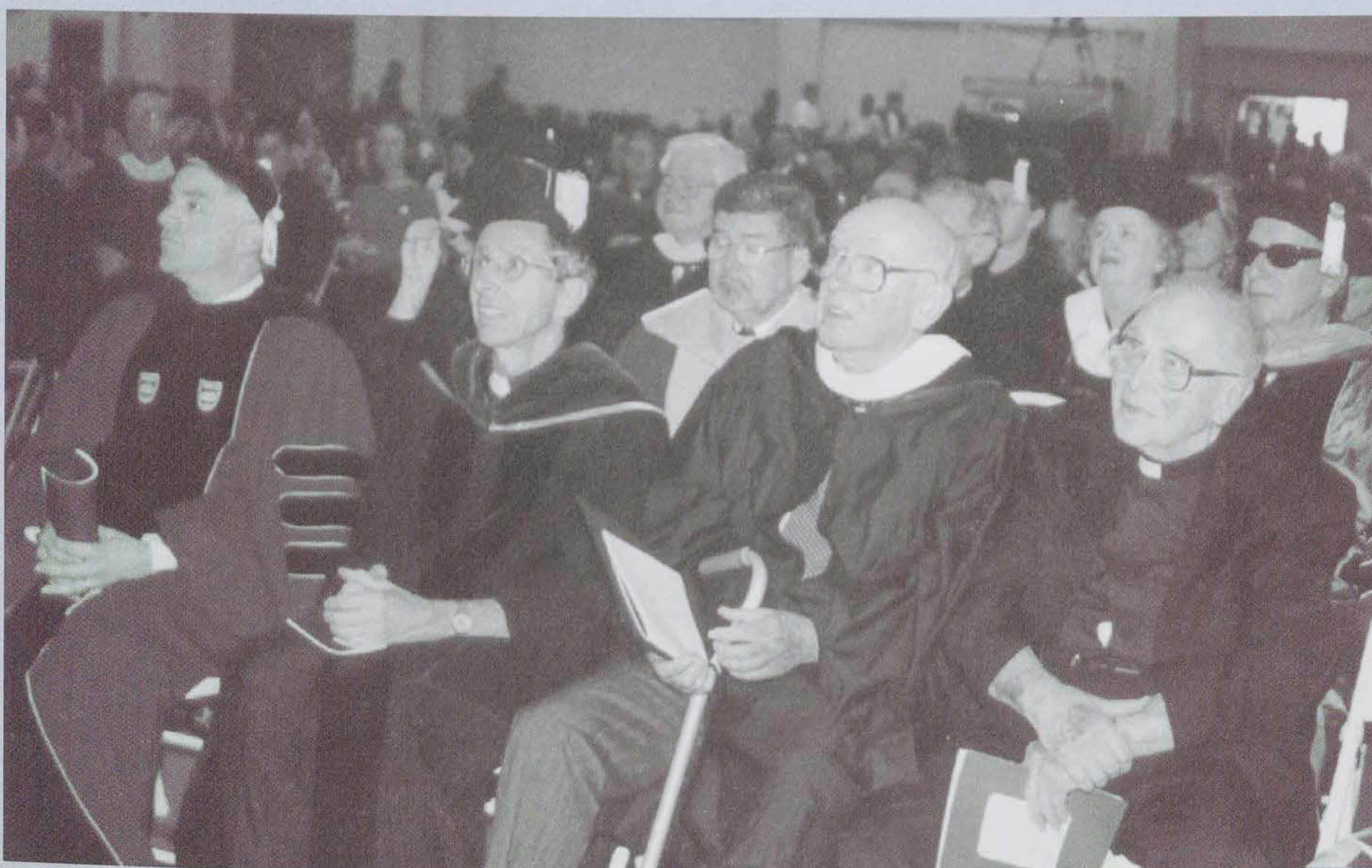
Fr. Cregan saluted President Emeritus/Chancellor Bartley MacPháidín, C.S.C. '59 for his 22 productive years as Stonehill president. He said, "It is with this same zeal [as Fr. MacPháidín] that I see the religious of Holy Cross today offering our service to the College and confirming the intuition of our founder Fr. Basil Anthony Moreau [C.S.C.] that to offer true education, one must educate the whole person and allow that education to take root in the soul of the person being educated. It is in the name of that great tradition that I join my efforts to that of my Holy Cross family here at Stonehill."

Perhaps the most significant faces Fr. Cregan spoke of were the faces of the children who shared their musical talents that day. The 50-member Sacred Heart Children's & Youth Choir and their families traveled from the Bronx to show support for Fr. Cregan as he was inaugurated. The choir sang to underscore the message of diversity and family spirit at the event.

"They are children in families who have been left behind or left out of the 'new economy' which has brought so much prosperity to so many in recent years," he said. "They are the families I grew up with and was part of in Newark, New Jersey and families with whom I've shared my life and ministry over the last 18 years in the Bedford-Stuyvesant neighborhood of Brooklyn; in Chimbote, Peru; in Caguas, Puerto Rico; and in the Highbridge neighborhood of the Bronx."



"It is my conviction that if Stonehill is going to continue to succeed in its aspirations toward greatness... it will be the work of all of us... to ensure that we do not leave behind those who are most in need of the kind of liberal arts education we offer here at Stonehill."

“In all of these places I have shared with wonderfully talented, generous and holy men, women and children who seek only the same opportunities that so many of us take for granted,” Fr. Cregan added. “It is a world that has formed me, nurtured me in my religious vocation and blessed me as I have sought to serve as pastor and counselor and friend. It is the experience and the ‘heart’ I bring to Stonehill.

“It is my conviction that if Stonehill is going to continue to succeed in its aspirations toward greatness and to fulfill the mission entrusted to it, then it will be the work of all of us, using the talents and gifts given to us by our Creator, to ensure that we do not leave behind those who are most in need of the kind of liberal arts education we offer here at Stonehill,” he continued.

“We struggle with the issue of diversity in every sense of that word – ethnic, social, economic and even intellectual – and recognize the implications, financial and otherwise, of decisions to promote diversity. Yet, it is my belief that we cannot shy away from this issue but must step forward with boldness but also with prudence in order to fulfill our mission. It is an exciting challenge and one that will engage us in the coming years.”

Fr. Cregan also spoke about the face of God. “In John’s Gospel, we hear Jesus saying: ‘Do not let your hearts be troubled, Have faith in God and faith in me.’ (Jn 14:1) Elsewhere John says: ‘As the Father has loved me so I have loved you, Live on in my love.’ (Jn 15:9)

“I believe with all my heart that we can achieve whatever our goals are if we live by those simple sayings: Do not walk with a troubled heart; Have faith in God; and Live on in God’s love,” Fr. Cregan stated.

“Whatever we aspire to be as an institution; wherever we see our mission leading us, in the end, as a Catholic College, we serve the mission of the Church and that mission is built on the foundation of love,” he concluded. “In my short time here as president, I have seen that sense of love radiate in so many ways among faculty, staff, students, alumni, parents, administrators, trustees and so many other groups who love the College. I pray that I can contribute to that sense of mission and, in the end, celebrate the triumphs that that kind of Spirit can create.”



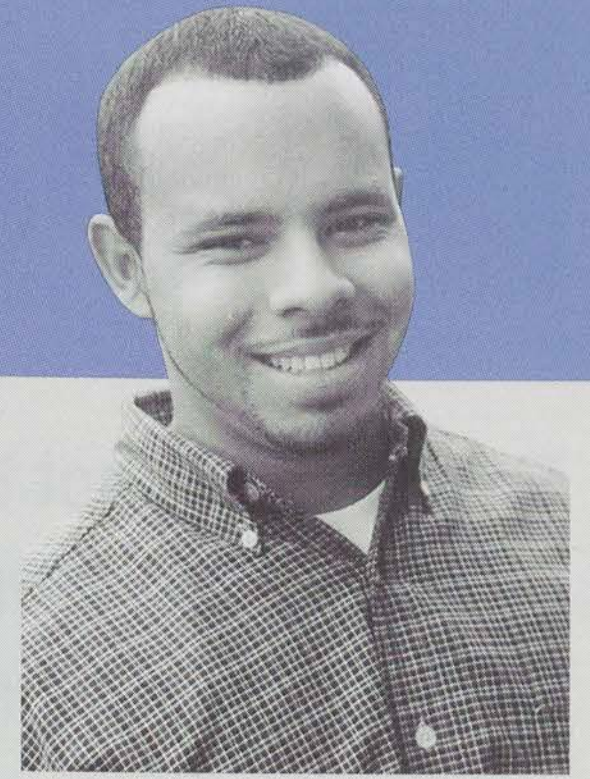

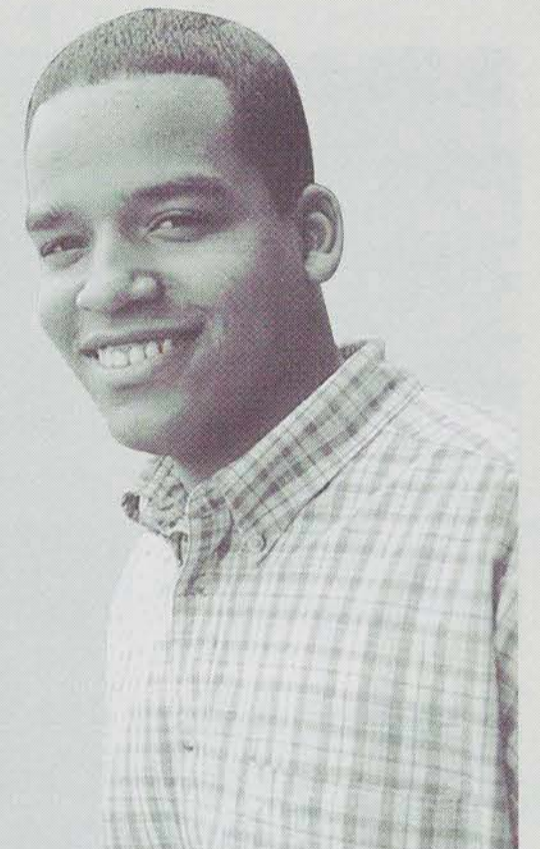

Balancing Act

Dick Yanikoski divides time between personal, professional and spiritual demands

Catch **Dick Yanikoski '68** in his off-hours, and you might find the Saint Xavier University president building furniture in his woodworking shop, perusing one of the 4,000 volumes on his copious bookshelves or kayaking on the Kankakee River.

"I believe in balance," explains Yanikoski, who came to SXU in 1994, a private, coeducational institution of 4,700 students in Chicago. "Being a university president is incredibly demanding. If you're not careful, you can burn out by not leaving time to read, write and rest."

Yanikoski maintains that a college president's life is full of balancing acts. In addition to honoring the personal and professional, "you also have to strike balance among the many university stakeholders, students, faculty, staff, donors, alumni and the local community — who are all scrambling to influence decisions."

"Presidents also have to weigh what's best for the university against individual needs. So many people have good ideas, but only a fraction can be funded at any given time. I want to be supportive of each individual, but sometimes can't," he reflects.

Yanikoski came to SXU armed with a doctorate in higher education from the University of Chicago and 19 years' experience at DePaul University. What lured him from being director of DePaul's public service graduate program to lead the then-troubled university? "I found compatible values, a desire to serve the least of society. I also was very impressed with the people. Everyone from the board chair to the faculty possessed a zeal for the mission," he notes.

"I also felt I could make a difference. SXU was on the ropes: They had a distinguished history, but a clouded future, and needed a strong leader. I felt I had the blend of experience and skills to help."

Yanikoski enjoys the presidency and the intellectual challenge of dealing with myriad issues. But it also can be draining. "It's not just the hours, but the nature of what goes on during those hours," he explains. "All important decisions flow up to you. You have to keep abreast of law, politics, accrediting standards, finance, educational trends, technology and fundraising. And despite the fact that you have authority, it's hard to wield it sometimes. Governance is shared at academic institutions. Colleges are encrusted with tradition and nuances distinct to academic life."

"I've spent most of my career in Catholic higher education," continues Yanikoski. "It all started at Stonehill, which gave me the first tangible

feel for what that was. Stonehill also made me a clear thinker. I formed habits of the mind as a philosophy major. I also greatly benefited from my intercollegiate debate experience, which taught me how to construct an argument, persuade an audience, research a subject and argue both sides. That training has stood me in good stead, and taught me that complex issues don't have simple answers."

Asked about the challenges facing American higher education, Yanikoski has ready answers. "Financial issues are the most pressing. The cost of providing a quality education is rising more quickly than tuition," he notes. "There's also great uncertainty as to the social role of higher education in decades to come. Distance learning, for-profit competition, and remote instruction have produced so many imponderables for comprehensive, urban universities."

Yanikoski draws an analogy to the health care field, which was building new facilities and adding services 30 years ago. "Compare that to today, when hospitals are closing or merging due to pressures from HMOs and PPOs. New techniques and procedures for health care delivery dramatically changed the role of the hospital," muses Yanikoski. "Higher education is the next frontier for radical changes in methods of delivery. This ought to be a huge concern to any president whose attention is on more than the present moment."

Keeping the Faith

Rev. Anthony DeConciliis, C.S.C. spreads the word about a small school on the move

Notre Dame College in Manchester, N.H., may be one of the Granite State's best-kept secrets. **Rev. Anthony DeConciliis, C.S.C. '63**, the institution's newly-minted fourth president, is out to change that. "Our vision statement says, 'We shall be known in the New England region as a quality comprehensive liberal arts institution dedicated to the whole person, mind, body and soul, in the Catholic tradition.' I'm looking to get the word out." Fr. DeConciliis accepted the top job at the 1,100-student coeducational institution in July, and has been evangelizing ever since.

Luckily, he's had ample opportunity. His October inauguration launched the college's 50th anniversary year, along with an impressive slate of events which brought Fr. DeConciliis in touch with groups of students, faculty, alumni, parents, community leaders, politicians and editorial boards. There, he's delivered his message of forward-thinking holistic education that acknowledges "the dignity of the person."

"Becoming president is the high point in my 25-year career in higher education," says the 59-year-old pastoral psychologist. "I've seen almost every aspect of the college experience — this completes the picture." DeConciliis came to NDC from the Washington Theological Union in Washington, D.C., where he was vice president for academic affairs, academic dean and associate professor of pastoral studies. Previous professional positions include: assistant professor of psychology at Stonehill; assistant professor of psychology and director of counseling at the University of Portland; vice president and dean for student affairs and associate professor of psychology at King's College; director of campus ministry at Bridgewater State College; and faculty member at St. Peter's High School, Saint Michael's College and the University of Portland.

Although enjoying the rigors of his new job, Fr. DeConciliis admits to missing his time in the classroom teaching students. The author of *Every Decision You Make is a Spiritual One* (Paulist Press, 1995), he recently had the chance to address Notre Dame's graduate physician assistant and physical therapy students on "Spirituality in Science."

"I loved doing that," says Fr. DeConciliis longingly. Asked if he hopes to teach at Notre Dame, he says he'd love to — eventually. "Right now, there's too much to do. This college needs an endowment," he states. Fr. DeConciliis is working to build NDC's financial resources with an impressive board of trustees, which includes the New Hampshire presidents of Verizon, and Fleet Bank.

Coming from Washington, D.C., Fr. DeConciliis is amazed at the tight-knit Manchester community. "Everyone here knows everyone. Giving

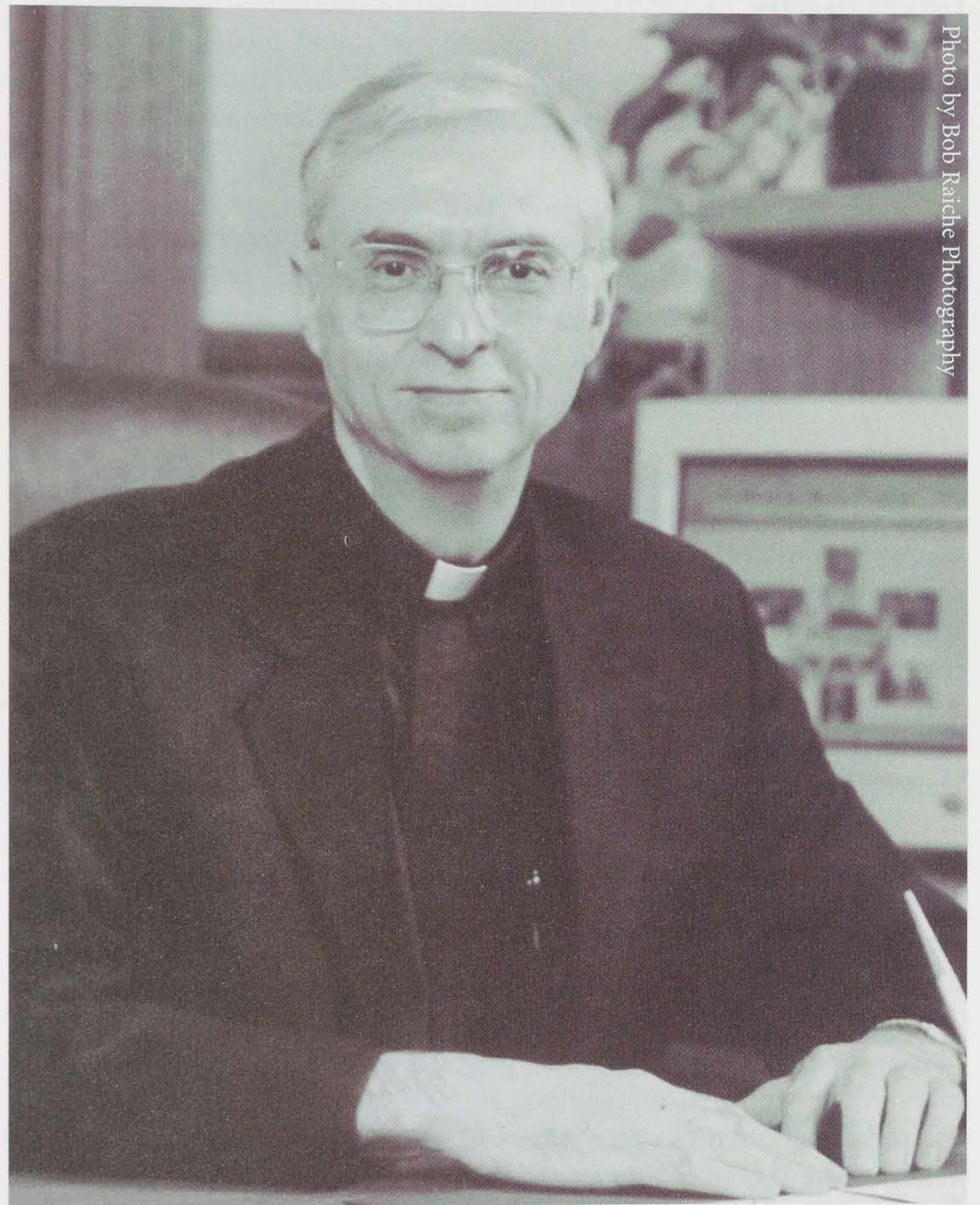

back to the community is part of the culture of neighbor helping neighbor, and Notre Dame is no exception. We consider that to be an integral part of our mission," says Fr. DeConciliis. Recent town-gown collaborations include: a collection of poems by area homeless men and women, edited by an NDC English professor and his students; the state's only theology program which trains deacons and lay ministers for the diocese; and "our physical therapy and physician assistant clinic that provides free medical care to anyone without health insurance," he notes.

Fr. DeConciliis knows he assumes the presidency at an extraordinarily challenging time for higher education. "The environment is changing very quickly," he explains. "As a Catholic college in the Holy Cross tradition, we bear a special responsibility. We need to stay true to our roots and seek out qualified faculty who are committed to Catholic higher education. And, with the knowledge and information revolution in full force, we need to prepare students to create meaningful lives amidst the flurry of a fast-paced world." Not simple tasks, but then again, Notre Dame College is a small school with big ambitions.

Return on Investment

Stonehill sets George Hagerty on the path to the president's office

George Hagerty '75, president of Franklin Pierce College, enjoys the beauty of southwestern New Hampshire year round. Situated in scenic Rindge between the base of Mount Monadnock and Pearly Pond, the college provides ready access to skiing, hiking and leaf peeping. That is, when he can find time.

"The modern college presidency is not the 'pipe and sherry' existence so often romanticized," says Hagerty, who assumed his post in May 1995. "The days are long and increasingly spent away from campus for fundraising and public events. Higher education is an ever-changing, competitive business."

Hagerty is the third president of the four-year coeducational liberal arts institution, chartered in 1962. Pierce is nationally recognized for its core curriculum, "The Individual and the Community," and received the 1997 Templeton Award for Character-Building Colleges. Under Hagerty's leadership, Pierce established a graduate program, offering an MBA; nine new sports; and two new majors, political science and information technology.

Hagerty credits Stonehill with preparing him for his rewarding career. "I came in a very raw student and really struggled. Things finally clicked during my sophomore year. I became involved in student government and other activities. I appreciate the investment Stonehill made in me, and the faculty who believed in me and motivated me," he says.

Hagerty went on to earn a master's and doctorate in education at Harvard, returning to Stonehill to complete internships in residence life and the president's office. After spending seven years in Washington, D.C., working for the U.S. Department of Education, Hagerty journeyed back to spend the next decade at Stonehill, first as the director of academic development and then as the director of corporate, foundation and government relations.

He assumed the Franklin Pierce presidency six years ago, feeling ready for the rigors of the position. Like Stonehill, Pierce is a young school with a small liberal arts college at its core. Pierce is 14 years younger than Stonehill, which Hagerty sees as an advantage because he recognizes parallels in the institutions' development.

"The challenges which small liberal arts colleges confront as they mature are similar: What can and should we do with limited resources? Upon what disciplines should we concentrate? We grappled with these issues at Stonehill in the '70s and '80s," he says.

Hagerty enjoys being president because it gives him "the ability to guide the future of the institution, and to create new programs that respond to increasing demands." Challenges include "controlling costs in a very labor-intensive industry. Like other presidents, I constantly have to weigh competing great ideas because we don't have the financial

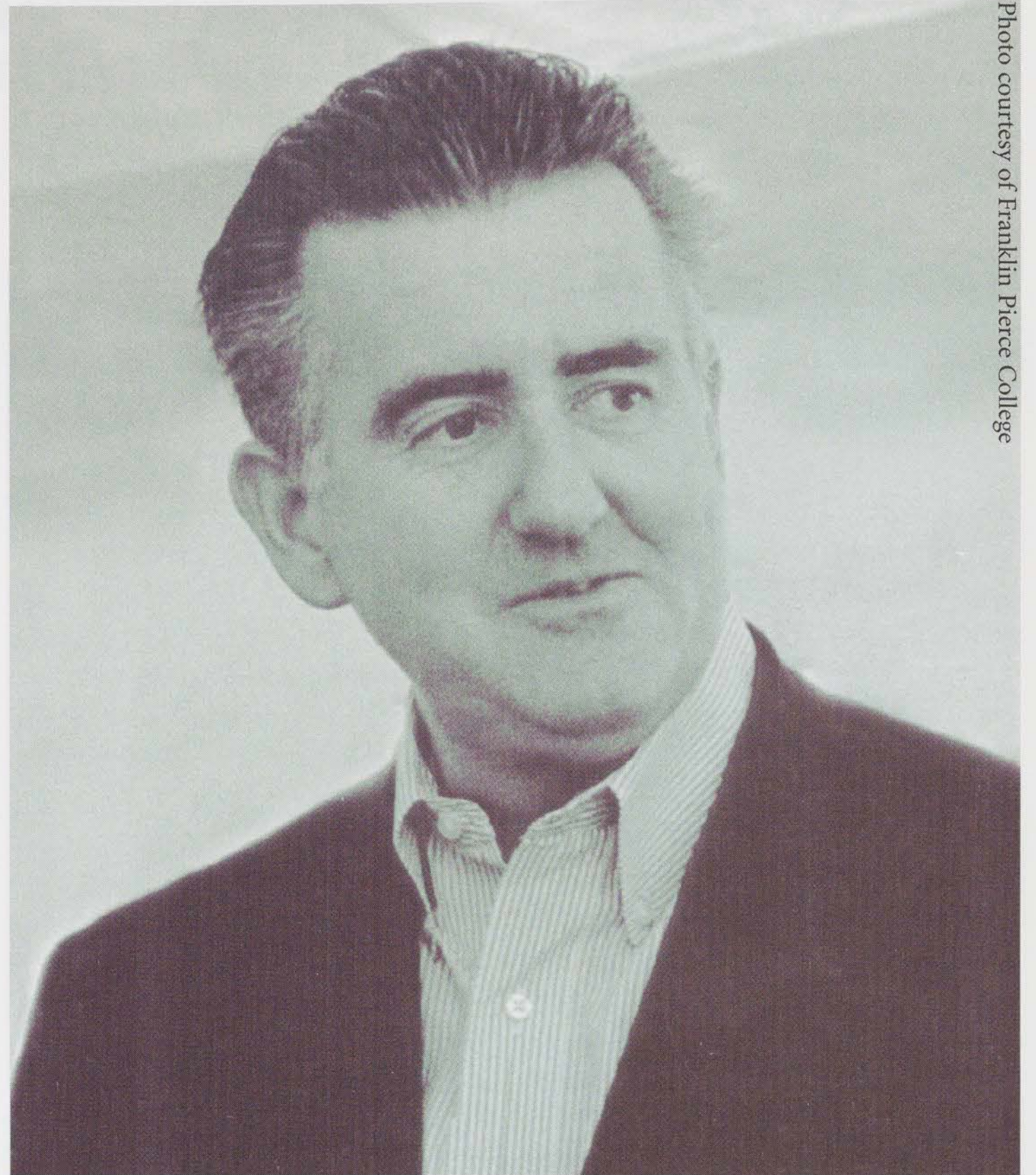

resources to do it all," he muses. Hagerty estimates he spends half his time fundraising, "which I enjoy, but I find time on the road disruptive. Campus life has a certain pace; if you become dislocated from the rhythm, it takes awhile to get back in," he explains.

Hagerty also finds the position "all-consuming." Much of his family life with wife Laura (D'Ambrosio) '78 and three children revolves around campus, attending receptions and athletic events. Hagerty has also learned, for all its public standing, the presidency is a lonely job. "You keep your own counsel, and sometimes have to make decisions that are extraordinarily painful — both personally and professionally," he reflects.

Hagerty's work is also complicated by the fact that he's legally blind. He suffers from a degenerative retinal condition first diagnosed when he was 19. He can no longer drive, read or participate in group sports. Though it's sometimes a struggle, Hagerty looks to the positive. "I'm in the perfect job. I have an incredibly supportive staff, and a driver who takes me where I need to go. My speeches are also much better — and shorter, based on five points I can remember rather than pages of notes."

Perhaps the only conflict Hagerty feels is when Pierce competes against Stonehill in the Northeast 10 Athletic Conference. Whom does he root for? "I am president of Franklin Pierce College," says Hagerty with a smile. He recounts a trip back to Easton last year to witness Pierce's stellar women's soccer team take on the Chieftains. "It was wonderful to be back on campus," he notes, "and see Franklin Pierce on the playing fields of my alma mater."

The Long View

Rev. MacPháidín reflects on presidential afterlife

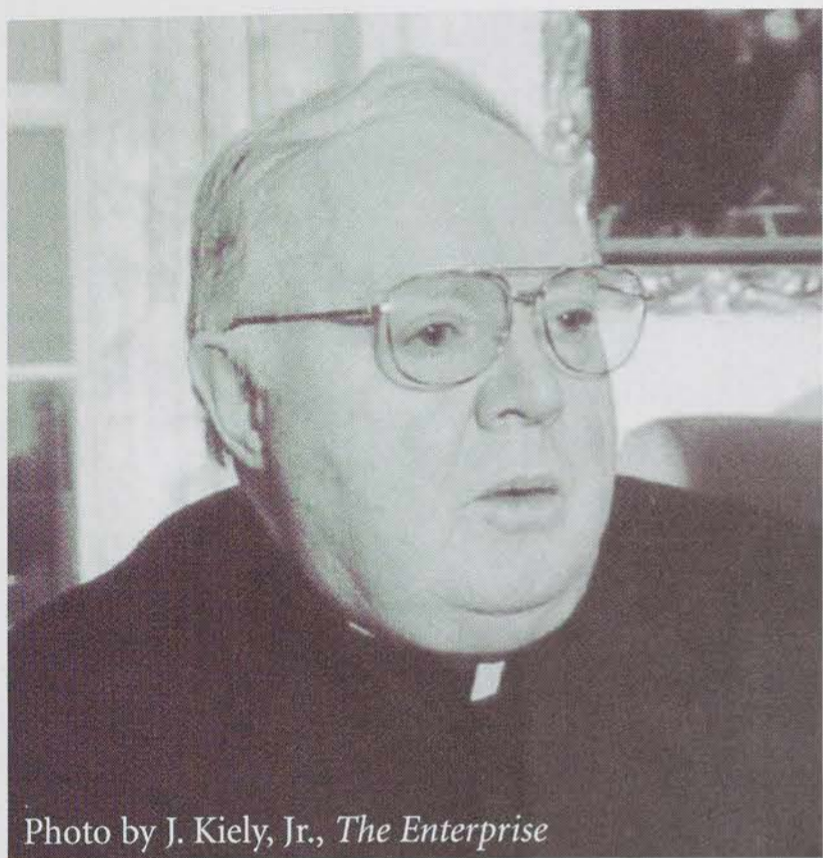

Under the watchful eye of **Rev. Bartley MacPháidín, C.S.C. '59**, Stonehill experienced an unprecedented 22-year growth spurt. During his tenure, the College expanded its reputation for academic excellence, built 21 facilities and secured \$100 million in endowment.

But that work is now past tense. Fr. MacPháidín is enjoying a well-deserved sabbatical year, first in

Rome, fall semester, and then in Israel, spring semester. He has two books in the works, and a revision of his memoir, *Coming Safely Home* for an American edition. He won't reveal their contents, except to say mysteriously, "they deal with spiritual subjects, they will be short and easily readable."

A scholar at heart, Fr. MacPháidín is happily anticipating quiet reflective time and the opportunity to put his life "back in normal perspective. When you're president, you're always conscious of tasks to do. The urgency is always there, even when you're traveling or on vacation. I now have the freedom to step back and take the long view, which includes a view of my fragmented self," he says.

But he confesses he'll miss the intellectual stimulation of running a 2,000-student liberal arts college. "No two days were ever the same. I had a lot to learn, and I learned a lot. The presidency was the best practical education I ever had," he says, "but that was made possible with the rich, broad foundation I had from the other stages of my life."

Fr. MacPháidín enjoyed using the power of the presidency "to help people in difficulty open doors they couldn't open themselves," he explains. Challenges included "securing the finances necessary for private, Catholic higher education. It goes against my grain to ask for money, even though a myth grew around me, that I raised funds easily. It never felt easy," he reflects.

Fr. MacPháidín also recalls the struggle to "assemble a curriculum that mediated the important liberal arts and also gave students solid preparation for the professions. It's a complex task," he muses. "I don't know a single place that's mastered it without avoiding specialization, or at the expense of general studies."

To current and future presidents, Fr. MacPháidín offers this wisdom: "Learn that the differences between institutions are relative, and there will always be schools better-known and wealthier than yours. There will also be schools less competitive and less well-endowed. So avoid the condescension with which the academic world is rife. Always represent your institution as it is, candidly and frankly, and learn from the problems others encounter." No doubt a philosophy that helped him cultivate Stonehill's phenomenal success.

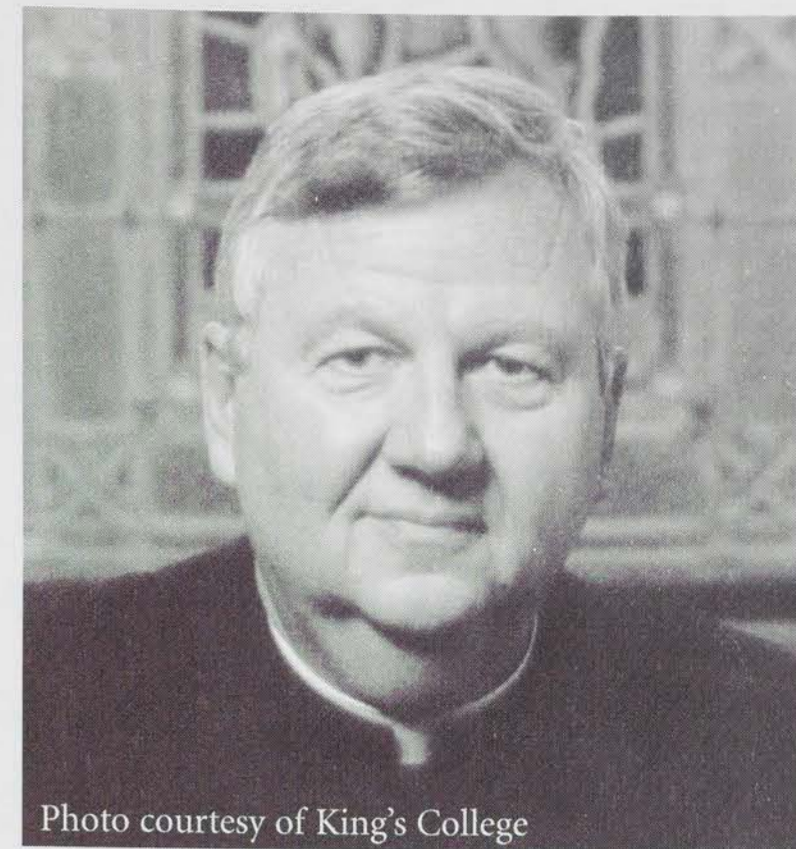

The Man Who Was at King's

There's no rest for Rev. James Lackenmier, C.S.C. as he directs a European study-abroad program

Salzburg, Austria, is a long way from Wilkes-Barre, Penn., but that's where former King's College president **Rev. James Lackenmier, C.S.C. '61** now hangs his hat. Head of the bustling northeast liberal arts college from 1981 to 1999, Fr. Lackenmier now serves as resident director of Kulturprogramm Portland, a study-abroad program for the University of Portland, like Stonehill and King's, a Holy Cross school.

"I'm the only staff member: a combination academic advisor, counselor and school nurse," says Fr. Lackenmier. "It's wonderful to be close to young people again. There's a terrific mix of students." The program provides 40 sophomores with the opportunity to immerse themselves in European culture. He accompanied the group to Paris last semester and leads a tour of Greece and Italy this spring.

Fr. Lackenmier enjoys the change of pace and feels he "left King's in good shape." Modest words from a president who saw his institution make repeat appearances in *U.S. World & News Report's* "Top 10 Regional Liberal Arts Colleges," conduct three successful capital campaigns, and increase its endowment from \$3 million to \$37 million.

His commitment to Holy Cross education began in 1956 when he came to Stonehill as a seminarian. There, he tackled the full gamut of the liberal arts, "an education that provided a foundation for lifelong learning," he says. "I had great teachers at Stonehill."

Fr. Lackenmier then embarked on what he calls "a ministry of higher education in the Holy Cross tradition." He served a variety of institutions before arriving at King's in 1973, where he directed campus ministry and then college development. Fr. Lackenmier assumed the presidency in 1981 at a critical juncture for the school. He faced a declining applicant population, an uncertain economy and the formidable task of recruiting faculty in a competitive market.

"Luckily, I was able to build a team who came together to advance King's," recounts Fr. Lackenmier. "But it was always a challenge to provide the highest quality education while staying true to our mission as a Catholic college *and* to fund financial aid for working class students."

His words of advice to current presidents: "Wake up each morning and do the best you can. If you're tired at the end of the day, then you're doing a good job."

Christine Donovan Named Chair of Stonehill's Alumni Fund



Christine Donovan '87, a Stonehill trustee, is the new chairperson of the College's annual Alumni Fund. Currently a managing director at Brown Brothers Harriman in Boston, Donovan founded Boston Global Advisors in 1993, a provider of securities lending services to institutional investors. Goldman Sachs acquired the company in 1996.

Donovan was a star basketball player during her years at the College and the captain of the women's basketball team. In 1996, she was inducted into the Stonehill Athletic Hall of Fame. A trustee since 1997 as well as an active alumna, Donovan wants to encourage more alumni, especially members of the younger classes, to participate in the Alumni Fund.

"My Stonehill experience prepared me well for professional life. It is important for younger alumni to get involved and help shape the

future of the College. We must contribute our time, talents and share our success to help build upon the tradition created by previous classes," Donovan said.

President Mark Cregan, C.S.C. welcomed Donovan's decision to lead the Alumni Fund. "As a trustee, I have worked with Christine and know her to be a talented and energetic professional as well as a good person. She loves Stonehill and her enthusiasm will be a real asset to the vitality and strength of the Alumni Fund this year. I look forward to assisting her in every way I can," said Fr. Cregan.

A resident of Abington, Donovan succeeds James "Lou" Gorman '53, executive consultant for community relations and special events for the Boston Red Sox, who served as Alumni Fund Chair since 1997. In 1999-2000, Gorman secured a 32% alumni participation rate, compared to a 28% participation rate the previous year.

2000 Reunion Giving Report

Reunion giving at Stonehill has become a vital component of the Alumni Fund. Over the years, reunion giving has increased, accounting for nearly 20% of the overall Alumni Fund. The 2000 reunion classes raised \$160,787 with 36% participation among the classes. Of note, the Class of 1975 raised \$49,468 in cash and pledges, and presented Stonehill with the largest class gift in the College's history.

Reunion Gift Committee members play a critical role in the success of this fundraising effort. Committees are lead by classmates who are committed to educating their peers on the importance of giving back to their alma mater and asking those individuals to join them in making a "stretch" to increase their annual giving in honor of their reunion.

Gifts & Grants

Professor of Sociology and Director of the Martin Institute **Kenneth Branco** and Economics Professor **Robert Rosenthal** were awarded a \$50,000 grant from the Massachusetts Campus Compact for a community-based research program. Designed in partnership with the Brockton Area Private Industry Council (BAPIC), the project will provide evaluation support to a network of community-based organizations while expanding the service learning opportunities of Stonehill students over a three-year period.

The Massachusetts Campus Compact has also awarded a \$25,000 grant to **The Learning Center**, a joint project of the Center for Social Concern at Stonehill, the Center's community-based partners, and residents of the Pleasant-Prospect neighborhood of Brockton.

An anonymous foundation in Boston has awarded Stonehill a \$100,000 grant for new science equipment.

Professor of Fine Arts **Carol Calo** and the College's Fine Arts Department received a \$22,000 grant for *Arts Outreach: Mentoring Through Photography & Dance*. This grant will fund a year-long program of photography and dance instruction, pairing Stonehill students with at-risk Brockton 5th and 6th graders; a collaboration with the Fuller Museum of Art and the Plymouth Country District Attorney's office.

The National Science Foundation has awarded Professor of History and Philosophy of Science **André Goddu** a \$50,000 grant for the project *Copernicus and the Aristotelian Tradition* that will support Goddu's sabbatical starting September 1, 2001.

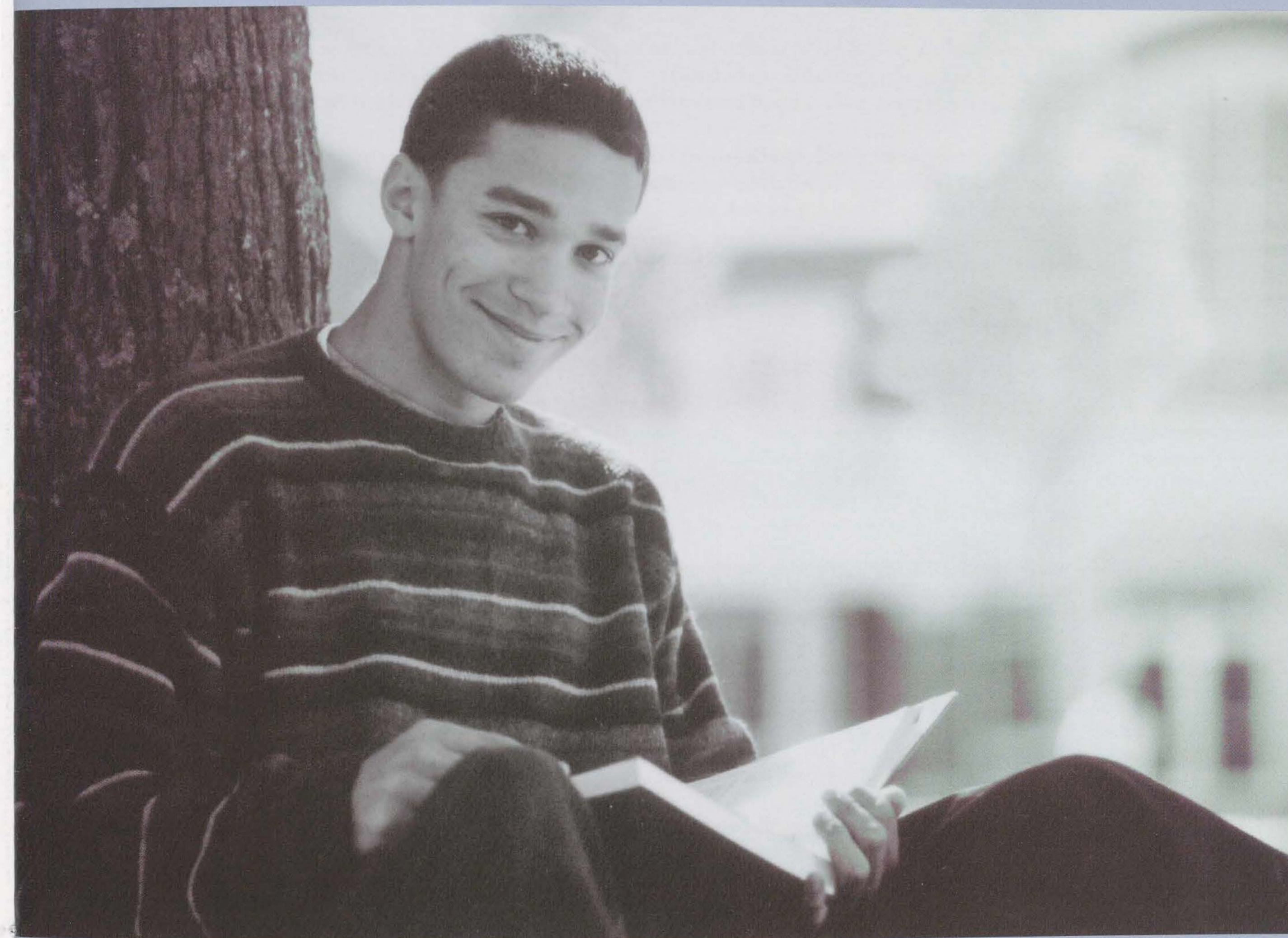
The **George I. Alden Trust** in Worcester has awarded Stonehill a \$75,000 grant for new science equipment.

The College has received a \$32,850 gift from the Estate of **Vincent Galvin**, a long-time resident of North Easton. Galvin's gift has been used in support of Stonehill's 20-sport intercollegiate athletic program.

The College received a gift of \$100,000 to establish the **Joseph F. Kenneally, DMD Scholarship Fund**. Given by his son-in-law, Paul Clark and his daughter, Maura, the scholarship was established in honor of Class of 1952 graduate Joe Kenneally's 70th birthday. The scholarship will be awarded annually, beginning in the Fall of 2001, to an academically qualified student with a demonstrated financial need enrolled in the Environmental Studies Program.

Established in July 2000 by family and friends, **The Ray Richard Memorial Scholarship Fund** is named in memory of Raymond Richard '61. The scholarship will be awarded annually to a Stonehill student who aspires to a career in journalism. In October, many of Richard's family, friends and colleagues participated in the first annual Ray Richard Memorial Golf Tournament, raising over \$10,000.

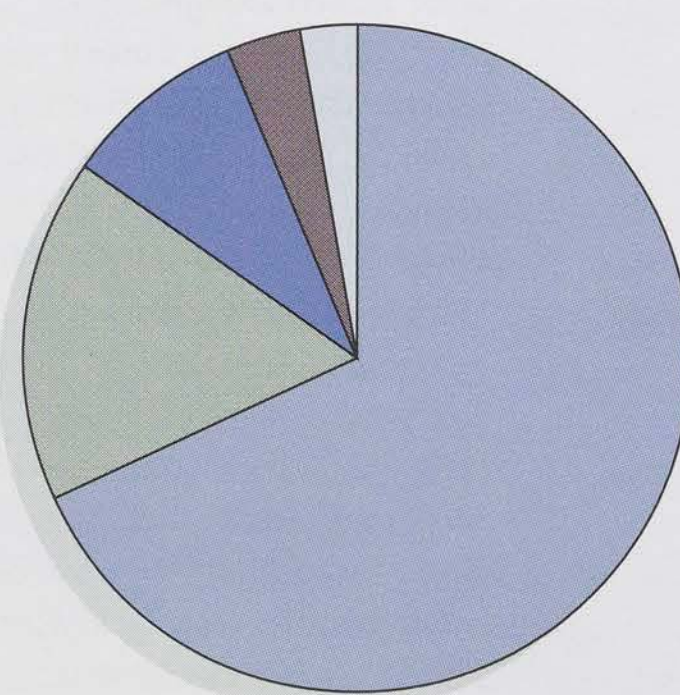

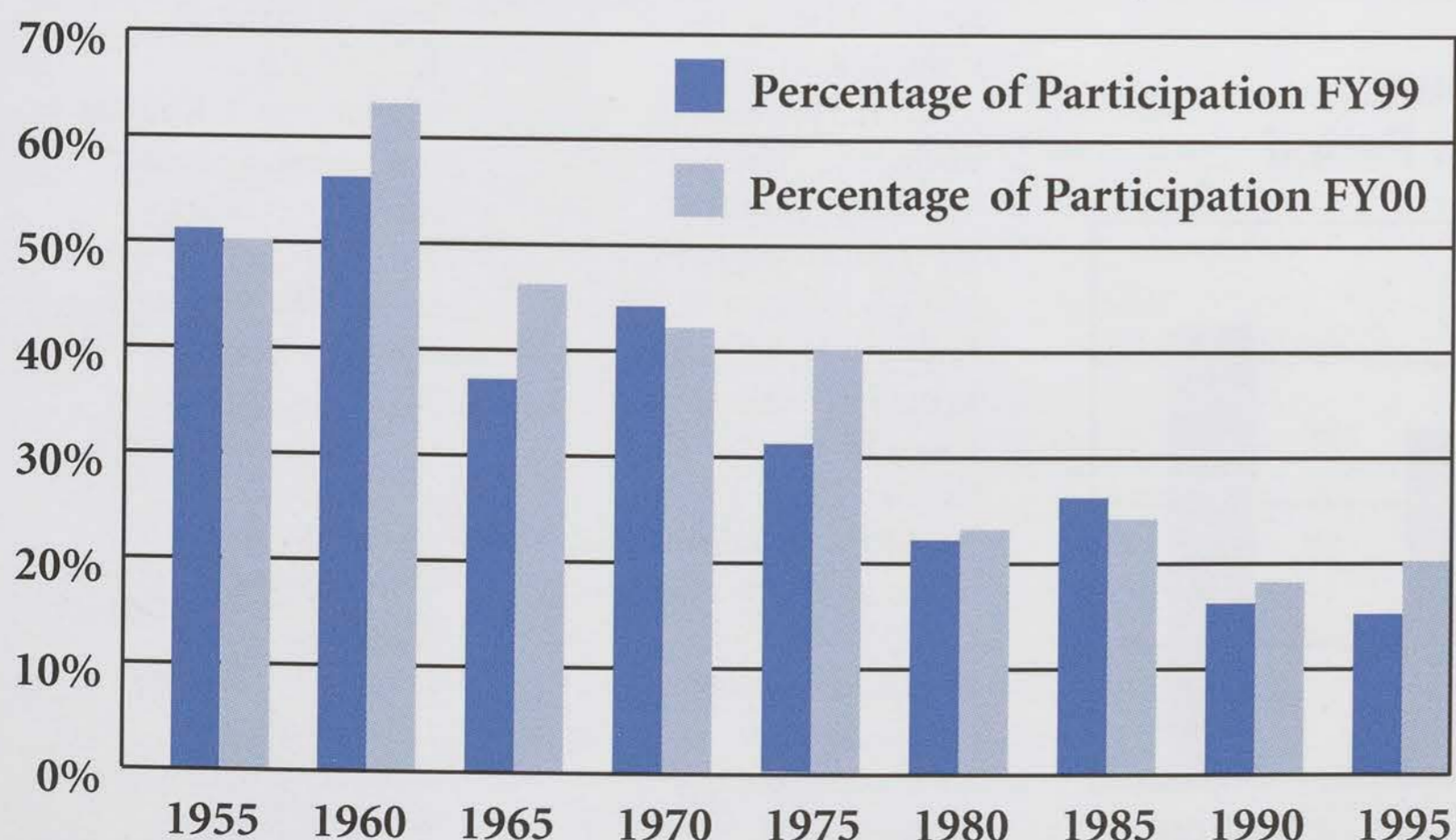

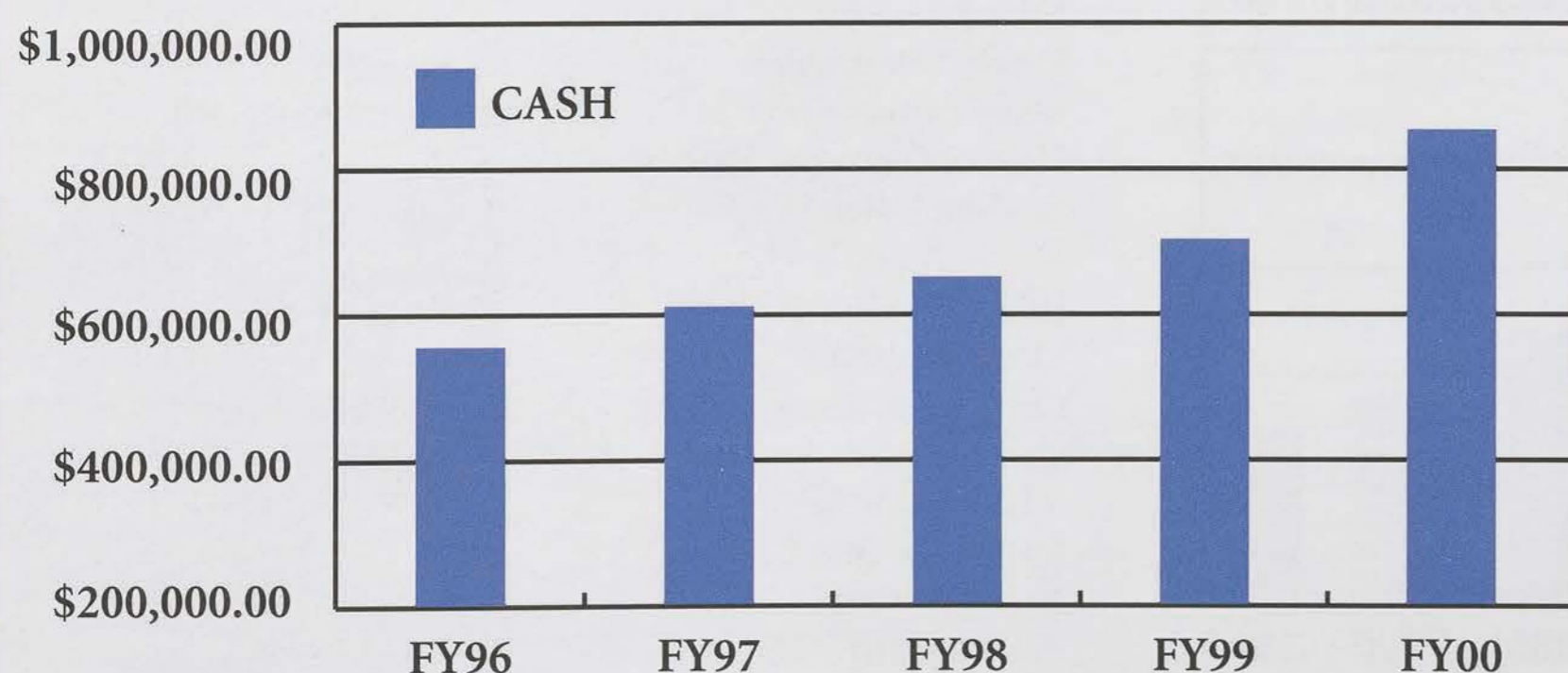

David Almeida, associate professor of education, presented a teaching reading workshop for the Adult Learning Center in Brockton.

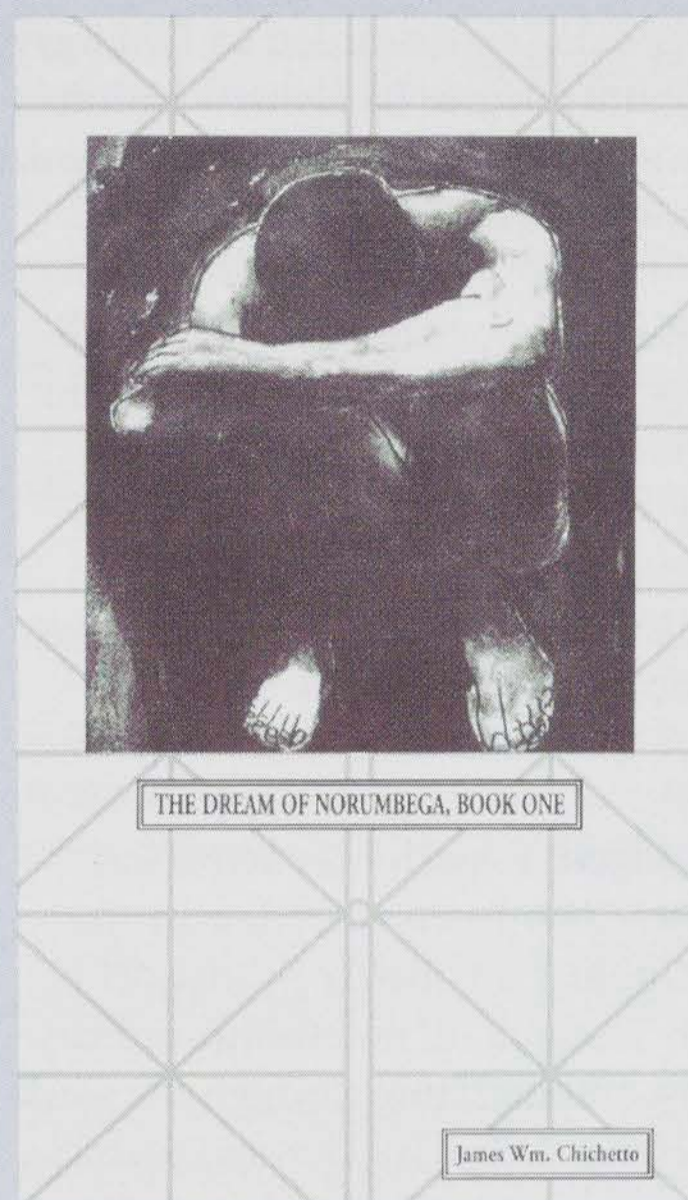
Antonio Barbagallo, associate professor of foreign languages, published "Concha Zardoya: poetisa, crítico y maestra en el exilio" in *La Mujer Hispana en el Mundo* and a book review of *Amor a los cuerpos* in *Cuadernos de Aldeeu*. He read a poetry selection at Casa de Guadalajara and delivered "Neruda, poeta irracional, metafísico y desesperado" at Asociación de Escritores in Madrid, Spain in June. Barbagallo also delivered "El Quijote: verosimilitud en la ficción de la verdad" at IV Congreso Internacional de la Asociación de Cervantistas in Lepanto, Greece in October.

Anthony Celano, professor of philosophy, published "Robert Kilwardby on the Relation of Virtue to Happiness" in *Medieval Philosophy and Theology*. He presented "From Priam to the Good Thief! The Significance of a Single Act in Greek Ethics and Medieval Moral Teaching" for the series, "Medieval Moral Teaching," at the Pontifical Institute of Medieval Studies at the University of Toronto in October.

Richard Finnegan '64, professor of political science, published "Ireland: Brussels and the Celtic Tiger" in *The European Union and the Member States: Cooperation, Coordination, and Compromise* and "Irish American Relations" in *Ireland in the World*. He presented "Threats to Twentieth Century Irish Democracy: Sinn Fein, the Catholic Church, The European Union and the Ulster Unionists" at the New England Conference for Irish Studies at the College of the Holy Cross in September. Finnegan was elected president of the New England Irish Studies Association in November.

André Goddu, associate professor of history and philosophy of science, received a short-term grant from IREX to conduct research in Cracow, Poland in June-July 2001. He also published an entry on "Impetus" in the *Encyclopedia of the Scientific Revolution*.

Amit Gupta, associate professor of political science, published "India's Draft Nuclear Doctrine" in *Round Table: The Commonwealth Journal of International Affairs* in July and "Building a Triad?" in *Pacifica Review: Peace, Security and Global Change* in June. Gupta also co-edited *India's Nuclear Security*.



Rev. James Chichetto, C.S.C., '64 assistant professor of writing, was awarded a \$2,500 writer's grant by the Saybrook House of *The Connecticut Poetry Review*(CPR) Press to complete and promote his 5,000-line poem, *The Dream of Norumbega*. Book One of *The Dream*, the first of six volumes with illustrations by Fr. Chichetto, was recently published by CPR Press. Fr. Chichetto explains, "as the first contacts between Algonkian peoples and Europeans took place, European cartographers produced the earliest maps of America's New England coastline. On these engraved and colored maps, the region was called, 'Norumbega,' a name of Algonkian origin." Through a series of fictive dialogues, *The Dream of Norumbega, Book One*, invokes the fall of the Algonkian peoples at the hands of Euro-American invaders in 17th century New England/Norumbega and addresses the subsequent attempts of these two distinct races to broker and reconcile their radically different religious and cultural perspectives. Last summer, he gave private and public readings from selections of *The Dream* at West Point and Connecticut College, among seven other sites. Fr. Chichetto is also listed

in a forthcoming volume of *Contemporary Authors*. He is the third Stonehill author (with professors **Chet Raymo** and **Michael Coogan** preceding him) to be chosen for inclusion in this series. His review, "Michael Lind's ALAMO, A Chunk of America's *Lebensraum*politik In Verse," was also published in the latest issue of *The Connecticut Poetry Review*. In May, he delivered "Poetic Image and Scientific Truth: A Communion of Metaphors" at the Connecticut Literary Forum in New London, Conn.

From Campus Minister to Balkan Observer By Sr. Grace Donovan, S.U.S.C.

In 2000, **Sr. Grace Donovan**, a former member of Campus Ministry and a professor of history at the College, was invited by Catholic Relief Services (CRS) to participate in a review of its relief and humanitarian operations in the Balkans. Currently the archivist for the Holy Union Sisters in the United States, Sr. Donovan spent several weeks traveling in the troubled and divided region. Below are some of her observations from her journey.

"Though Albanians and Serbs were again working together in Skopje, Macedonia, socially they had become more segregated. It was disheartening, more than 30 years after Vatican II, to experience such a situation. The citizens -majority Orthodox, minority Muslim, small percentage Roman Catholic, indefinite number agnostic or atheist - could not unite in humanitarian efforts based on the simple CRS formula, 'need not creed.' All, however, could proudly inform me that this city of her birth had erected a memorial to Albanian Mother Teresa.

"On the outskirts of Sarajevo, my CRS guide and I noted the beauty of the autumn scene. To the left of the colorful trees appeared a house slowly being rebuilt; to the right, a pile of rubble in which a family was trying to make the cellar area livable. A woman emerged from her windowless house with a cup of tea and an orange for her niece's companion. The paradox of sinful violence and gracious hospitality was forcefully evident. In the city center, I stood by the bridge where the Archduke Ferdinand was assassinated in 1914, thereby starting WWI. During the recent conflicts, the roadway had also served as a dividing line for snipers. It was not difficult to understand that trauma counseling is still a prime need for those of all ages. My new friend, whose father is Serb, mother Croat, informed me calmly that SFOR (Sarajevo Peace Force) will remain for decades, else there will be war once again among Serbs, Croats, Muslims. After returning to the U.S., I visited Gettysburg. On that battlefield, I prayed that we would approach reconstruction in the Balkans with the realization that true peace requires transformation of attitudes, and conversion of minds and hearts."

Ali Hicks, assistant director of residence life, received the Massachusetts Outstanding New Professional award from the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA).

R. Ward Holder, assistant professor of religious studies, presented "Calvin's Preaching" in November at the Sixteenth Century Studies Conference and participated in a panel discussion on the use of imagery in political elections titled "Symbols, Labels & Loyalties" at Stonehill in November. His article, "Ecclesia, Legenda Atque Intelligenda Scriptura: The Church as Discerning Community in Calvin's Hermeneutic," was accepted for publication by the *Calvin Theological Journal*.

Stuart Kane, English instructor, published "Horseplay: Robin Hood, Guy of Gisborne, and the Negotiation of the Bestial" in *Violence and Transgression*. He presented "Facial Rhetoric and the Place of the Subject in Middle English Balladry" at the Modern Languages Association Annual Convention in Washington, D.C. in December.

Len Krisak, English instructor, received the Richard Wilbur Prize in Poetry for his book, *Even As We Speak*, in March. In June, he chaired a panel, "On First Books," at the West Chester University Poetry Conference.

John Lanci, associate professor of religious studies, offered two workshops on "Bringing the Church Home" as part of the adult education program at Corpus Christi Church in Auburndale in November and December. 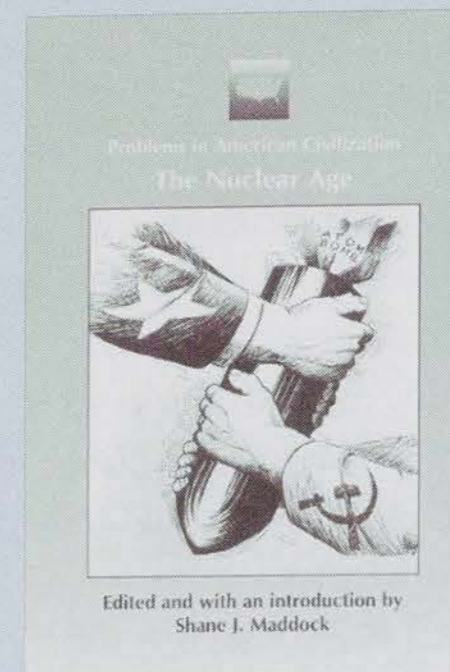

In June, he presented "Synge, Ostrovsky: Divorce and the Early Modern Irish Theatre" at the annual meeting of the American Conference for Irish Studies at the University of Limerick, Ireland.

Sr. Martha Westwater, S.C., adjunct English instructor, published *Giant Despair Meets Hopeful: Kristevan Readings in Adolescent Fiction*. *Giant Despair* studies contemporary adolescent fiction by applying Julia Kristeva's psychoanalytic theory to the burgeoning literature for young adults. According to Sr. Westwater, this literature depicts a despairing, disillusioned world where teenagers suffer from family breakdowns, violence, peer pressure, and abuse. She says that such depressing literature need not breed despair because, as Kristeva argues, "so long as we have love, we have hope." Six novelists are studied: Aidan Chambers, Robert Cormier, Kevin Major, Jan Mark, Katherine Paterson and Patricia Wrightson.



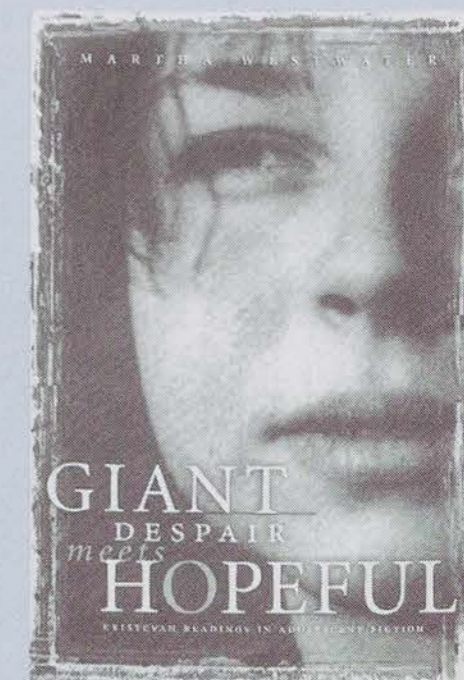

at the New England Historical Association Fall Meeting in October at Stonehill.

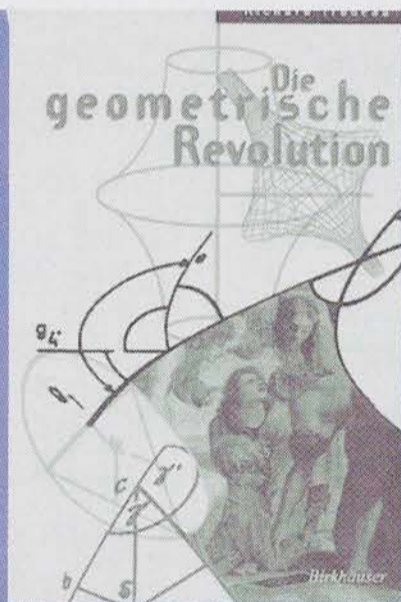

Stonehill in the news

In February, the *Sun Chronicle* featured Professor of Religious Studies **Michael Coogan** and his recently released third edition of the *New Oxford Annotated Bible, New Revised Standard Version*.

In February, the *Patriot Ledger* quoted Associate Professor of Education **Walter Devine** in an article on teacher certification tests. In March, the *Ledger* quoted Director of Financial Aid **Eileen O’Leary** in a couple of financial aid stories.

In February, the *Sports Women* section of *The Boston Globe* profiled Athletic Director **Paula Sullivan**. In December, *The Boston Sunday Globe’s South Weekly* named Sullivan as its Sportswoman of the Year 2000.

In February, a ruling against Stonehill by the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination attracted local media attention. An MCAD officer ruled that the College had paid a mathematics professor less than his peers. Stonehill denies it discriminated against the professor and is appealing the case to the full Commission.

In February, the Curator of the Stonehill Tofias Industrial History Center **Greg Galer** was quoted in an Associated Press story about the Ames shovels, which ran in several newspapers including *The Boston Globe*.

In January, Associate Professor of Writing **Virginia Polanski** was quoted in a *Patriot Ledger* article on the challenge of dealing with plagiarism in colleges today.

In January, a lawsuit against the College by a Stonehill student with a severe eating disorder received considerable regional and national media attention. The student charges that the College discriminates against her on the basis of her illness. The College contends that she needs more medical care than it can provide and that she is not ready physically or emotionally to return at this time.

In January, the *Patriot Ledger* quoted **Maj. Gerald Catrett**, who is in charge of Stonehill’s ROTC program, in an article, “ROTC: Alive and Well,” which reported that area ROTC programs are experiencing healthy enrollments.

In December, the *Washington Times* published an article by Stonehill senior **Matt Pillsbury** entitled “Yes, Virginia, There is a Santa Claus...sort of.”

In December, *The Providence Journal* published “A Credibility, Not a Constitutional, Crisis” by Professor of Economics **Robert Rosenthal**, which examined the Supreme Court’s ruling on the presidential election in Florida. In July, the same paper published “My Fair Bigot,” an article on racial bigotry by Rosenthal.

Both during and after the November U.S. presidential election, Professor of Political Science **James Millikan** was in demand from the media. His insights on America’s political system and on the Electoral College were quoted in the *Boston Herald*, the *Providence Journal*, the *Patriot Ledger* and the *Sun Chronicle*. He was quoted on several occasions in *Liberation*, one of France’s leading daily newspapers. He appeared on *WGBH-TV’s Greater Boston* program and in several local media outlets as well.

Also in the run up to the presidential election, the *Sun Chronicle* published the results of a poll of local voters, which was conducted by Stonehill students. The poll was a class project involving honors students taught by **Richard Driscoll**, a mathematics professor, and **Larry Overlan**, a political science professor.

In December, the *Patriot Ledger* quoted Dean of Admissions and Enrollment **Brian Murphy** in a story on early college applicants.

In November, the *Sun Chronicle* quoted Professor of History Emeritus **James Kenneally** in “Area Bucks State in Elections,” an article that examined local election trends.

In October, the *Boston Herald* quoted Associate Professor of Sociology and Criminology **Daniel LeClair** in “All the Rage: Bay State Judges Argue for Anger Management.”

In June, the *Boston Herald* quoted Professor of Religious Studies **Peter Beisheim** in “Crusading for the Truth,” an article that examined a new book about the Papacy.

Gorman Presented with Alumni Service Award

The Alumni Service Award, which is awarded to graduates who have volunteered their time and talents for the betterment of the College and the Alumni Association, was awarded to **James "Lou" Gorman '53** in November. Gorman, executive consultant for community relations and special events for the Boston Red Sox, is the first person in Stonehill history to receive both the Alumni Service Award and the Outstanding Alumnus Award, which he received in 1979. Marsha Moses: Outstanding Alumnus Award 2000

As a leader in the race to find a cure for cancer, **Marsha Moses '75** is an exemplary alumna of whom the College is proud. In January, Stonehill honored Moses for her professional success by presenting her with the 2000 Outstanding Alumnus Award.

As a biochemist, Moses deals in cutting-edge research where her considerable expertise is applied to the fight against cancer. In March 1999, Moses, along with her colleagues at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and at the Children's Hospital, identified a tumor-starving protein called Troponin I, which has been shown to prevent the spread of tumors in mice. With the discovery of Troponin I, Moses and her colleagues developed two tumor-starving drugs, angiostatin and endostatin. Tumor-starving, according to the National Cancer Institute, is seen as the most promising avenue in cancer research. When these two drugs were combined, they shrank tumors in mice to the point of invisibility. Human testing recently began on endostatin, and patients are doing well so far, according to Dana Farber/Partners Cancer Care.

Moses has been an assistant professor of surgery at Harvard Medical School and the Children's Hospital in Boston since 1992. She has also been a research associate at the Children's Hospital since 1990.

After graduating from Stonehill in 1975, she went to Rivier College in New Hampshire where she earned a master's of science degree in biology. In 1986, she received a doctoral degree in biochemistry from Boston

University. She is a member of numerous professional societies, including the American Association for Cancer Research and the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Moses has been very active in her professional life, but she has consistently stayed involved with her alma mater. In 1997, Moses spoke at Academic Convocation and received the President's Medal for Excellence. During her remarks at Convocation, she paid tribute to her Stonehill Biology professors, noting that courses taught by professors Sandra McAlister and Fr. Francis Hurley, C.S.C. gave her the strong foundation that she needed for graduate work and for contemporary research. Currently a member of Stonehill's Board of Trustees, she has also mentored the College's biology majors in her laboratory at the Children's Hospital.

Moses was joined by her husband, **Gerard Gardner '75**, members of the Alumni Council and the Biology Department when she received the award in January.

In accepting the award Moses said, "It is a treasured feeling to know that the college of your choice, has followed your career, monitored your progress and taken sufficient pride in them to invite you back home."

“Whether you are a recent graduate seeking your first professional position or a seasoned alum with a number of years of work experience, direct personal networking remains the single most powerful weapon at your disposal in the battlefield that is the job market. That power comes from the fact that any direct personal knowledge that someone may have about you – and it does not need to be a detailed understanding of your skills and abilities – raises you significantly above the threshold that is created by someone’s resume. You become a known entity and the individual who is acting as your network contact can serve as an advocate for your candidacy as appropriate.”

There are 1,300 Stonehill graduates in the Alumni Career Network. Being a member of the Alumni Career Network does not require much time or energy; but these alumni volunteers are providing an invaluable service to the Stonehill community.

Members of the Network allow their business information to be included in a database (accessible in both the Offices of Career Services and Alumni Affairs) and will assist current students and fellow alumni seeking information related to job searches. “We are seeing more and more students taking advantage of the Alumni Career Network,” says Director of Career Services Laura Mills-Lewis. “They are recognizing the value in contacting alumni working in their field of interest. An informational interview can be an invaluable tool for someone in a job search.”

In addition to being contacted for informational interviews, the Alumni Career Network volunteers are called upon to assist with various programs. Members of the Student Alumni Association (SAA) tap into the Network when planning Alumni Career Panels and similar events. This fall, 30 Network volunteers participated in career-related programs on campus.

The SAA also utilized the Network for its annual Shadow Day program. Sixty members of the Class of 2001 were matched with a Network volunteer, who agreed to host the seniors at their business for a day. **Staci Nealon ’01** enjoyed the time she spent

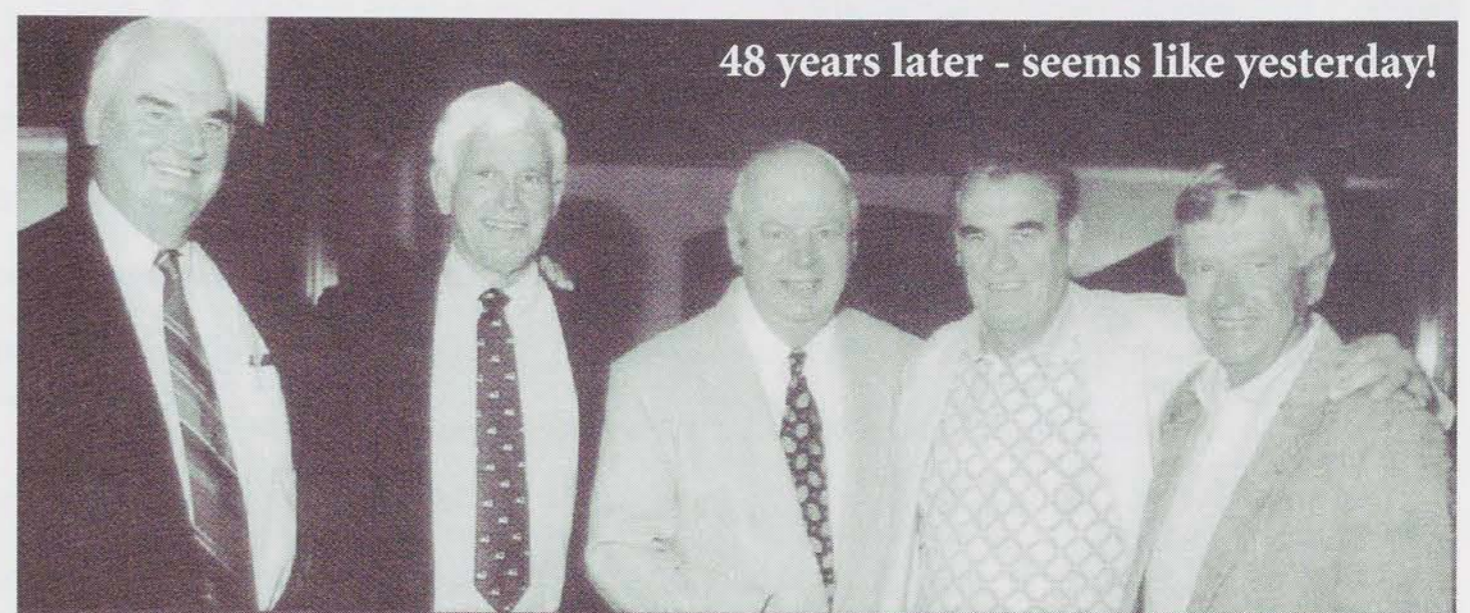

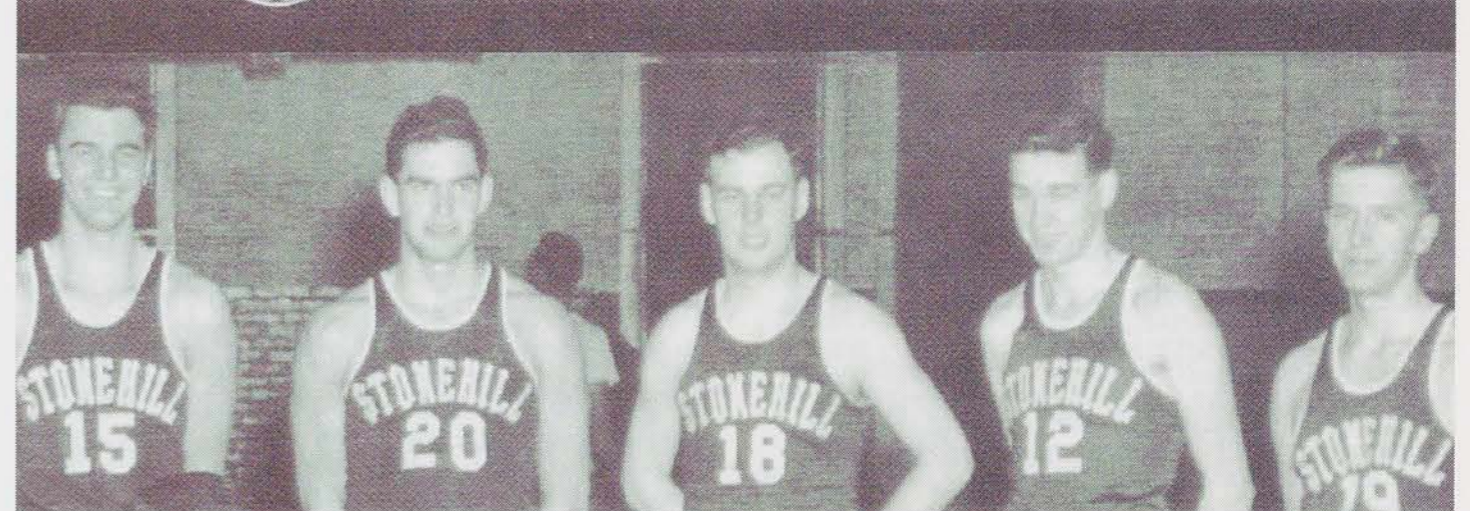
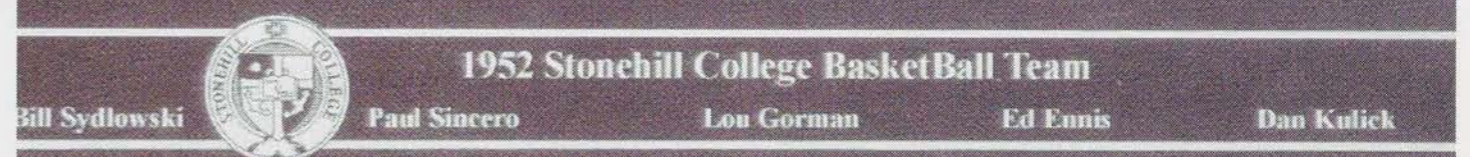

Class Ring Finds its Way Home. Shortly after she graduated from Stonehill with a degree in English in 1958, **Herberta (Mara) Lyons** was on a road trip to Florida and lost her class ring. At a rest stop in New York, she took the ring off to wash her hands and left it behind. She didn't realize her mistake until it was too late and thought the ring was lost for good. Unbeknownst to Lyons, a woman found the ring in the restroom. Being an honest person with good intentions, she decided to take it home and mail it to Stonehill. Time passed, however, and she forgot all about the ring. Herberta married Frank Lyons in 1961, and shortly after had two sons, Frank Jr. and Timothy. She worked as a teacher for eight years and then for a wedding cake decorating business for 13 years. Fast forward 42 years later: Database Manager Mary Boyd in the Alumni Office receives an email from a woman whose family had a 1958 Stonehill class ring. Boyd took this lead and the Alumni Office sent a letter out to all potential owners of the lost ring. The Great Fallacy

My friend Patrick works deep within the hectic bowels of the computing center at a North Shore college. There he confronts on a daily basis what he calls “the two worlds,” the real world and the good world. In the good world, he says, everyone meets deadlines with ease, no one is dishonest or in a bad mood, everyone works 60-hour weeks in joyous cooperation, and everything turns out right in the end.

Not so in the real world.

“Ah, yes,” he says to a colleague who needs some print-outs in an hour. “In the good world you would have them. But this is the real world, and we’re pretty backed up down here; you’ll get them tomorrow.”

Although we have never talked about it, I suspect this notion of two worlds developed quite naturally out of Patrick’s upbringing as a Christian. Christians, be they church-ed or not, often assume the validity of what theologian Robert McAfee Brown calls the “Great Fallacy”: There are two worlds—this one and the next. This world is the realm of material imperfection, the next is the world of the pure and the perfect. This is the world of the body, the flesh, while the next is the domain of the spirit.

This “two world” way of looking at life seeped into the Jewish movement that became Christianity through its contact with the gentile philosophical schools of the Greco-Roman world. Peruse the scriptures—Jewish and Christian—and you will look long and hard for any consistent evidence of McAfee Brown’s Great Fallacy. Most Jews of Jesus’ time lived in one world, not two. For these people, there was no “next world,” the realm (a/k/a “kingdom”) of God, proclaimed by Jesus and inhabited by his ancestors, was in their midst, not waiting for them on the other side of the grave.

Do I propose here some avant garde or New Age spin on western religion? Not at all! From the first chapters of Genesis, in which the Creator God walks in the cool of a garden evening, to the Christians’ New Testament, in which the Word made flesh, Jesus, eats and drinks and talks and later knocks Paul off his horse in a play of revelatory light, scripture presents us with a single world co-inhabited by the spirit of God and the human community. Sorry, Patrick. At least in the realm of biblical theology, the real world and the good world are one.

The theological morphing of one biblical world into two has implications for all of us, not just Christians. If a critical mass of people believes that they will attain the fullness of life only after death, our world becomes for them a waiting room or perhaps a testing ground.

Either way, it is not where they think they really belong, and if that is the case, there’s not much reason to cherish our world here and now. As they await the supernatural bliss of heaven, they are in danger of missing the natural miracles all around them every day, while at the same time mindlessly consuming the environment as though it were as valuable as junk food or tissue paper.

If the real world is merely a place where we are put to the test so God can discern who is worthy of the good world, people will logically want to know the ground rules behind this most final of exams.

Pushed to the extreme—hey, the stakes are pretty high here!—religion becomes predominantly a set of laws and regulations. Faith becomes intellectual consent to a creed—a ticket of admission—rather than a nourishing experience of the divine.

People who aren’t sure they’re going to get into a Red Sox game, much less heaven, are not happy campers, and their edginess can affect those around them, even those not in the same line. Witness the role religion is playing in current American political discourse, a lot of publicly religious folk these days seem down-right cranky!

Now, I do not mean to make light of religion, God knows; I make my living by teaching it. But Christianity is not at its essence a set of rules to be followed or a creed to be swallowed, though both sacred law and religious truth statements rightly hold prominent places in any religion.

At its essence, biblical Christianity is an experience, the experience of the world as a place inhabited (and redeemed) by God, with God’s Spirit moving in every nook and cranny of ordinary human activity. Indeed, Christians at their best see life as an on-going conversation (important word!) between God and God’s creation. Christians at their best foster an inclusive, generous community dedicated to justice and the right to a full and graced life in this world for everyone, not just believers. At their best, Christians understand that this world is still a garden, a cherished site of miracles no less impressive than those accomplished by Jesus in ancient Palestine.

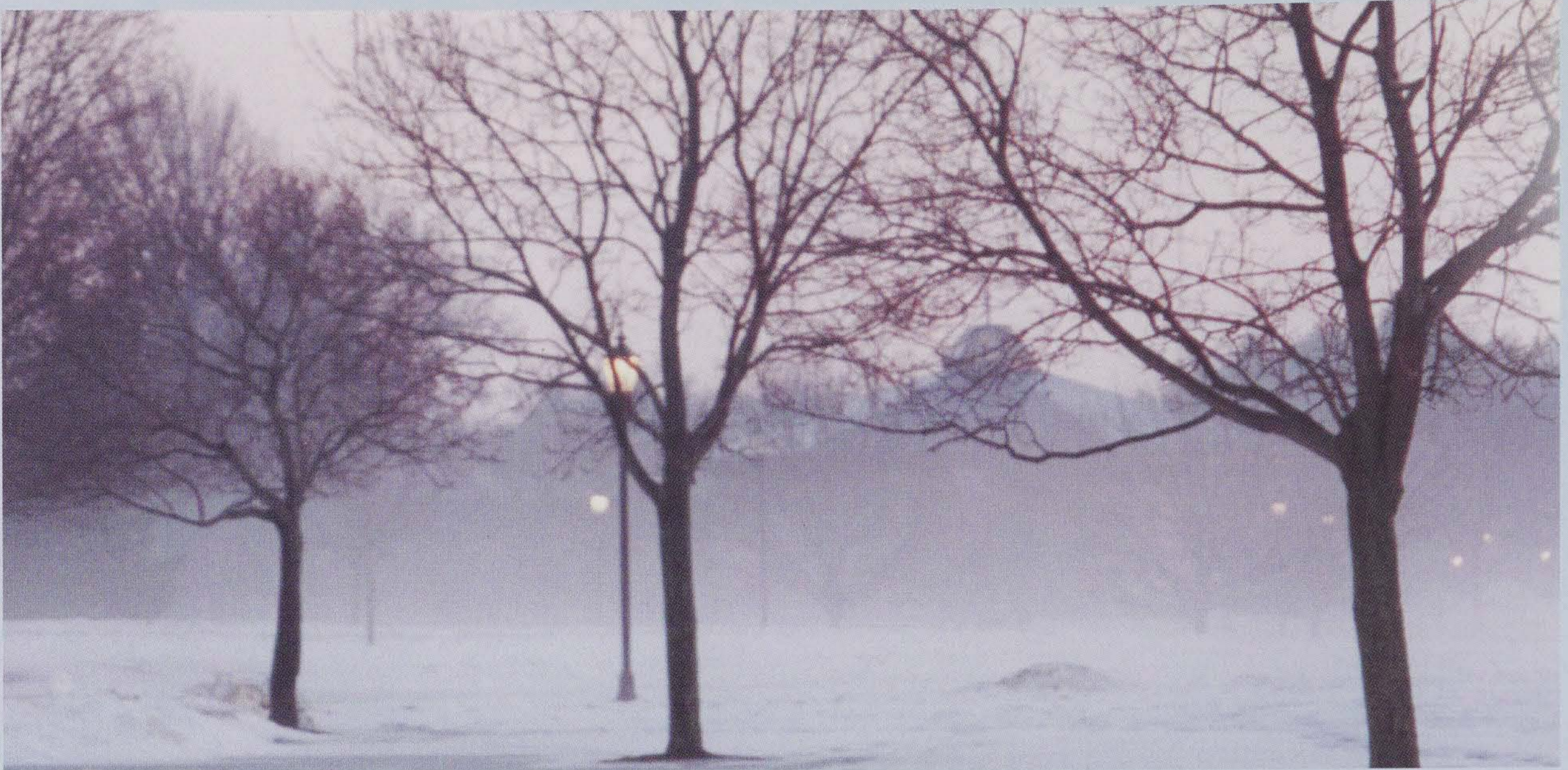
When the great fallacy of the two worlds takes hold, the inclusive, generous conversation instigated by Jesus is stilled. Christianity becomes a club characterized by house rules designed to aid believers in a scramble for “personal” salvation. Important though personal conversion is, biblical Christianity is a call to a communal appreciation of the divine present here and now.

Don’t get me wrong. I am not denying the existence of a pretty fine afterlife. I suggest, though, that we put heaven in its place, just as Jesus did. Whenever he was asked about what the afterlife would be like, he always responded the same way, with some variation of “Shut up!” (freely translated from the Greek!). “Don’t worry about heaven,” he counseled. “It’ll be great. Look around you and tend to your garden—and your neighbor—here and now.”

Put another way by a later Christian saint, “All the way to heaven is heaven.”
